We the undersigned Viewers appointed by
your Honor to view the location of a bridge
across Pine Run in Chest Township, Clearfield
County as set forth in attached order, met as
per notices duly served and posted, and
having been severally affirmed according to

being a point where a new road has been

recommend the construction of a good substantial
reinforced concrete bridge at this place, the
same to be erected at the cost and expense
of the County of Clearfield. The approaches to be filled

between abutments. 16 ft Roadway. 5 1/2 ft clearance above low water mark.
