

Thence by line between John Rongrant and Alex Coutre's lands North Eighty-six and one half degrees west Seven hundred and fifty-five feet to a pine stump. Thence North Sixty-four degrees west One hundred and eighty-two feet to a point in the public road running from Central point to Sandy.

Which said road so as aforesaid laid out by us we are of opinion is necessary for a public road.

We would further report that that portion of the public road running from Central point to Sandy between the point of ending of above described road and the

point where the Said road from







No. 1 May Sessions, 1910.

Now, May 25th, 1910, I hereby concur in the Report of the Viewers and recommendation of the Grand Jury, to the effect that the County appropriate County funds towards the building of a bridge across Stump Creek, in Brady Township, as provided by the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided. This approval is conditioned upon the amount of the appropriation to said bridge being made by the said Commissioners after careful estimate by a competent engineer has been made of the kind of structure and whole cost thereof; also upon condition that the said bridge shall be erected of more lasting material and in a more complete way than has heretofore been done by steel structures over small streams in Townships. We believe that over such a stream as is here involved there should be nothing else than a solid concrete monolithic structure erected, and if the Commissioners and the Brady Township Supervisors agree on this that the plans and specifications thereof be submitted to the Court for approval before a final award of bids.
