Now, May 25th, 1910, I hereby concur in the Report of the Viewers and recommendation of the Grand Jury, to the effect that the County appropriate County funds towards the building of a bridge across Stump Creek, in Brady Township, as provided by the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided. This approval is conditioned upon the amount of the appropriation to said bridge being made by the said Commissioners after careful estimate by a competent engineer has been made of the kind of structure and whole cost thereof; also upon condition that the said bridge shall be erected of more lasting material and in a more complete way than has heretofore been done by steel structures over small streams in Townships.
