

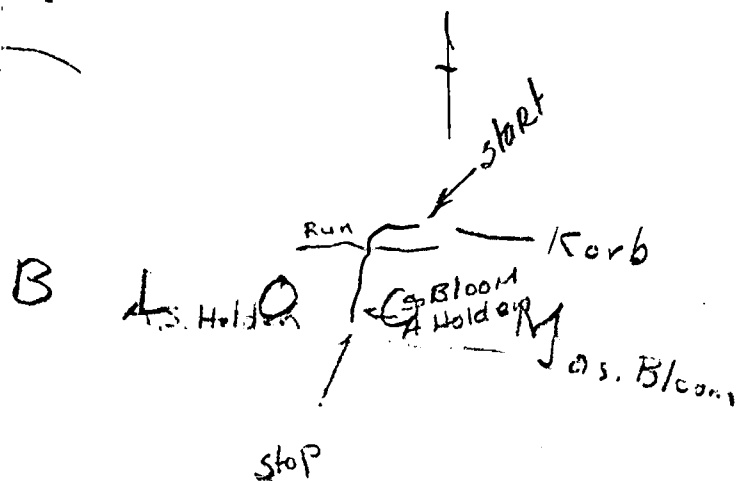

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the *28* day of *Sept* A. D. 186*4* before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Blouin* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *at or near the* *House of A. S. Holden to the house* *of Adam Barb in Blouin Tp*

Say neither damages are claimed

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thomas Moore, Gainer Blouin & Wm Irwin

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

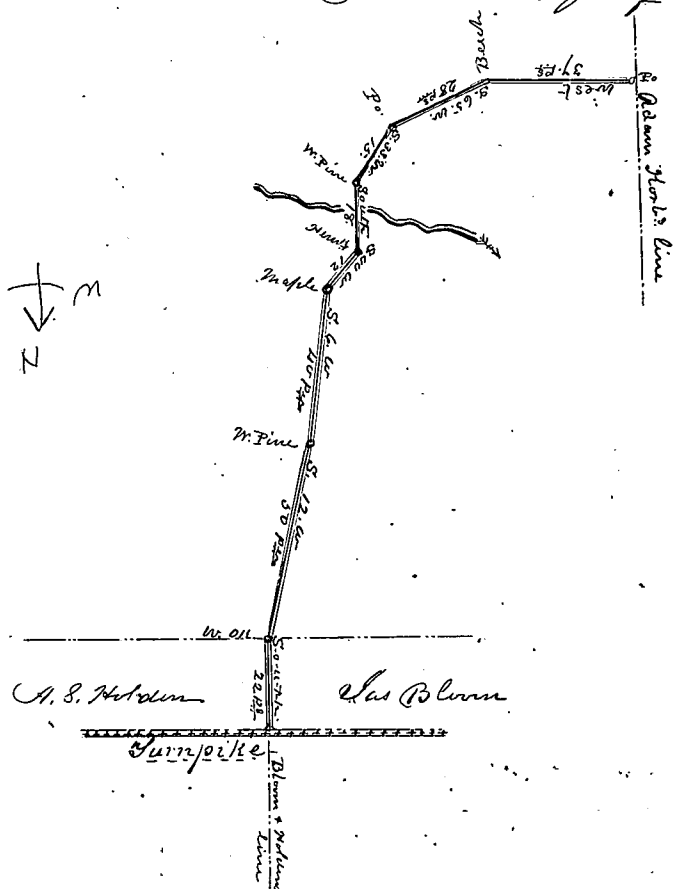

of Cheshire Co.

We the Viewers appointed by the foregoing
Order of Court to view and lay out the road therein described
Do Report That in pursuance of said appointment we all
met and having previously given ten day notice by printed
advertisements put up according to Law of the time and place
of said view and notice having been given to the owners & oc-
cupants of several lands through which said road passes of the same
and we having enquired of the damages resulting to any one by
reason of the passage of said road have ascertained that no damage
results to any one and having been duly Affirmed have
viewed laid out and on Return for Public use the following
road viz Commencing at a post on line and at the end of lane of
Adam Hobb therein West thirty seven perches to a Beech South sixty five deg
west twenty eight perches to a post South thirty three deg west fifteen perches
to a white Pine South eighteen perches to a Hemlock South forty deg west
thirteen perches to a maple South six deg west forty perches to a white Pine South
thirteen deg west fifty perches to a w. or. & cor of James Belton Esqr & Algernon Holden
thence along said Belton & Holdens line South twenty two perches to the Turnpike
near Algernon Holdens a Plot or draft of which is herewith annexed
