





The petition of the undersigned citizens of the Township of Beccaria, and the Borough of Coalport, in said county, respectfully represents:-

That a petition was presented to your Honorable Court, on Sep 22nd, 1910, praying for a view on a proposed public road from the end of Mill Street in the Borough of Coalport to a point where Union Street in the village of Rose Bud intersects the public road leading from Blain City to Iriona; that thereupon the Court appointed J.S. McCreery, P.B. Zentmyer and D.R. Fullerton, viewers, who filed their report in due form recommending the opening of said road for public use, which finding and report was duly confirmed absolutely, by the Court, at the February Session of said Court, 1911; and the opening order was issued on the 27th day of February, 1911, the said opening order lodged with the Supervisors of said Township of Beccaria, in which the whole of said road lies, and due notice given to all of the supervisors of the issue of said opening order, at or near that time.

That a petition had been presented to your Honorable Court to No 3 Dec Sessions 1910, praying for a public Bridge over Clearfield Creek, at the lower end of Mill Street in the Borough of Coalport, in said county, which would be at the end of this proposed public road, which was finally approved by the viewers, the Court and the County Commissioners together with two Grand Juries, and a contract let for said bridge, in due and legal form, by the County Commissioners, on Sep 23rd 1911, to J.A. Lord, who complied with all conditions and legal requirements and is now en-

gaged in the construction of said bridge.

That the Supervisors, of Beccaria Township, William Gates, L.Z.Nevling and N.S.Lyle, after a long delay, opened that part of said proposed public road along the line of Union Street in the village of Rose Bud, but have neglected and refused to complete the opening of said road by ~~constructing~~ constructing that portion between Union Street and the end of Mill Street, at the point where said public bridge is being erected , and to the repeated notices and requests of those interested in the opening of the same, have refused and neglected to obey the order of your Honorable Court and open the same. That the expense of the same will be small and there is no reason why it should not be opened at once, and that the failure to open the same is seriously interfering with the building of the bridge, which is much needed for public use.

Your petitioners would therefore pray the Court that an attachemnt be issued for the said William Gates, L.Z.Nevling and N.S.Lyle, and they will ever pray &c

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22 day of Sept^r, A. D. 1870, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of ~~Beaverdale~~, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from a point on the Borger line at the Western end of Mill St. in the Borough of ~~Clearfield~~ Coalport to a point where Union St. in the village of Roseland in said Township intersects the public road leading from Blair City through said village of Roseland

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McCleery, P. B. Gentzler, and D. R. Gileston, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

REPORT of VIEWERS.

To the Honorable Judge Of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by your Honorable Court, to view and lay out a road in Beccaria Township, as shown by accompanying order, respectfully report: - That all your viewers were present, and having been severally affirmed, did view the location of proposed road, and have laid out the same, and return for public use as follows, to wit:

Beginning at point "A", on the line of plot of village of Rosebud, and the lands of Blain Run Coal Co, thence through said Coal Co lands, by line conforming with the center line of Union St. S. 20° West, 200 feet to a point. thence still by same lands, S. 75° East, 178 feet to point on line of 33 ft Coal Siding. Crossing same on grade, 100 ft to return siding, (grade crossing) Thence by same bearing 173 feet to 66 ft right of way of P.R.R. (main line Irvona to Cresson). Crossing same on grade, 66 feet to line of W.H.Craft.

Across land of W.H.Craft, 176 feet to the left bank of Clearfield Creek.

Across said Creek by location of Bridge recommended by former viewers, 120 feet to Mill Street, in Coalport Bor' o, (point "B") all of which is set forth on accompanying draft, which is a part of this report. Which road as laid out is in our opinion necessary for a public road, including Union St, to the public road leading to Blain City, as laid out, and partly opened.

Respectfully submitted this 18th day of November, A.D. 1910.

We further recommend that the Street known as "Union Street", in the village of Rosebud, from point "A", to the Road to Blain City, as set forth in the petition, be completed for public use at the expense of Beccaria Township, the same being opened and partially graded. This addition is added to our report to comply with the order of Court.

The answer of William Gates, L. G. Neveling and N. S. Lyle, supervisors of Beccaria Township to the petition for attachment issued in this case respectfully represents:-

First:- That this proceeding is oppressive and designed for the purpose of accumulating costs and expense and was presented without notice to the respondents or their attorneys, it being well known to the petitioners that respondents were represented by counsel residing in Clearfield.

Second:- That at the time the petition in this proceeding was presented praying for public road a petition was presented praying for public bridge at the lower end of Mill Street in Coalport Borough which would be at the end of the proposed public road and which proceeding was for a long time under consideration by the various authorities having jurisdiction thereof.

Third:- That at the time the opening order for this road issued there was no means of crossing Clearfield Creek at the location proposed and the construction of the road until the question of the construction of the bridge was finally settled was utterly useless. That the respondents and their counsel conferred with the County Commissioners and informed them of the readiness of the supervisors to construct the road, if the proceedings for public bridge were approved, and when informed that the commissioners had finally approved the construction of the bridge proceeded to open the said public road, and opened the proposed public road along the line of the Union Street. That from the corner of Peck lot near the Blain Run Colliery which road extends

178 feet to Railroad sidings, thence another one hundred feet to railroad siding; thence 173 feet to the Main line of the P. R. R., running from ~~Bellwood~~ to ^{Cresson} ~~Irvona~~ ^{Irvona} ~~Punxsutawney~~; thence 276 feet to the bank of the Creek and the opening of said road and travel across the said railroad tracks and to the bank of the creek was not only useless but dangerous and incurred the risk of subjecting the Township to damages and travellers to injury.

That crossings have not yet been constructed at the points where the said road crosses the said railroad sidings and track, and even if constructed there is no legitimate travel which could exist upon said road until the construction of said bridge, as the said road does not connect with any other road between Union Street and Mill Street.

That the respondents are informed by the contractors for the construction of said bridge, that the bridge will not be ready for travel for about two months and were further informed by the said contractor that he would not use the said road in the building of the said bridge as his materials and equipment would be handled from the Coalport side.

That the said bridge is located a very short distance from the bridge across Clearfield creek at Blain City, and this whole proceeding is much more designed for the use, benefit of the few individuals than the use of the general public.

That the respondents at the time the petition was presented were engaged in working upon the opening and construction of the said road, and were so engaged when the rule for attachment was served upon them, all of which was known to the petitioners or some of them.

That the averment in said petition that the failure to open the road is seriously interfering with the building of the bridge is untrue.

That your petitioners are neither refusing nor neglecting to obey the opening order but would have said road in proper condition for public use whenever the same can be used in connection with the bridge being constructed but deny that there is any duty imposed upon them to render said road a place of danger to the public and of liability to the Township.

They, therefore, pray that the rule issued be discharged at the costs of the petitioners.
