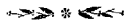

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that

A certain public road beginning at a point ~~at or near~~ the residence of D. H. Fulton in Lawrence Township and extending to a fording of the Susquehanna River known as the Bradford Ford, has become useless, dangerous and is of no service whatever to the citizens of either Lawrence or Bradford Townships, and the maintenance of said road and care for same is a great expense upon the tax payers of Lawrence Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~view~~ vacate the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reed, G. Paul Goss and J. E. Kratzer, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

 Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
