Now, therefore, this 22nd day of March, 1912, the terms and conditions of the within confirmation absolute are hereby withdrawn and the said bridge is confirmed absolutely.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 28th day of Sept, A. D.

1911, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union in said

County, setting forth that the Bridge across

Anderson Creek at a point where the same is crossed by Public Road leading from public Road near White Head to public Road from Rockton to Home Camp, which crosses Anderson Creek not far below the Reservoir of the DuBois Water Company is becoming ruinous and in need of reconstruction. That the cost of construction of a permanent bridge at this point is more than the Township of Union is able to pay and the same should be constructed as a County Bridge.

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, All the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the site proposed for the within mentioned bridge, and we do agree that there is occasion for the building of a new bridge, as desired by the petitioners, and that the erecting of such Bridge will require more expense than is reasonable that the Township of Union should bear. That the bridge where the public road crosses Anderson Creek, at the point described in the within order, is necessary for the use of the general traveling public as well as being an R. F. D. mail route; Therefore we have laid out a Bridge, where the public road, leading from a public road near Whiteheads, to a public road leading from Rockton to Home Camp, crosses said Anderson Creek, not far below the DuBois Borough Reservoir, and do return said Bridge, as, and for a county Bridge, to wit:— Beginning at a point in the center of the public road, on the east bank of said Creek, thence N. 85° W. fifty (50) feet to a point in the center of said road, so as to give a clear span of 50 ft. between the abutments of said bridge. The abutments to be built eight (8) feet high above low water, and long enough to make the Bridge fifteen feet wide. That before the said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity, ten day before said meeting. That notice of said meeting was given to the County Commissioners, as well as to the Supervisors of Union Township, as per Notice hereto attached. That Hapdon McDonald, J. W. LaBorde and H. W. Hallopeter, Supervisors, were present at said view, And we annex a plot or draft of said bridge laid out, stating the course, length, and height of said bridge. Now, February Sessions, 1912, the within Report of Viewers and approval of the Grand Jury as to the necessity of the bridge herein mentioned, and also of the fact that said bridge would be too expensive for Union Township to bear alone, is hereby confirmed absolutely on the following terms and conditions:

1. That said bridge shall not be entered of record as a County bridge but as an appropriation bridge, under the Act of 1887, as amended by the Act of 1895.

2. That in order to determine the amount of appropriation which should be made by Clearfield County Commissioners towards the erection of said bridge, the said County Commissioners shall first employ an engineer who shall make plans and specifications for the same, to be reported back to the said Commissioners and to the Court, together with a careful estimate of the cost thereof, just as though the said bridge were to be built wholly by the County.

3. That after the said plans, specifications and estimates have been made, the proper amount shall be agreed upon by the County Commissioners in conjunction with the Supervisors of said Union Township and that agreement submitted to the Court for final approval.

4. That thereafter the said bridge shall be built only after a public letting, to be joined in by the said County Commissioners and Supervisors of Union Township, which bids shall also be submitted for the approval of the Court.

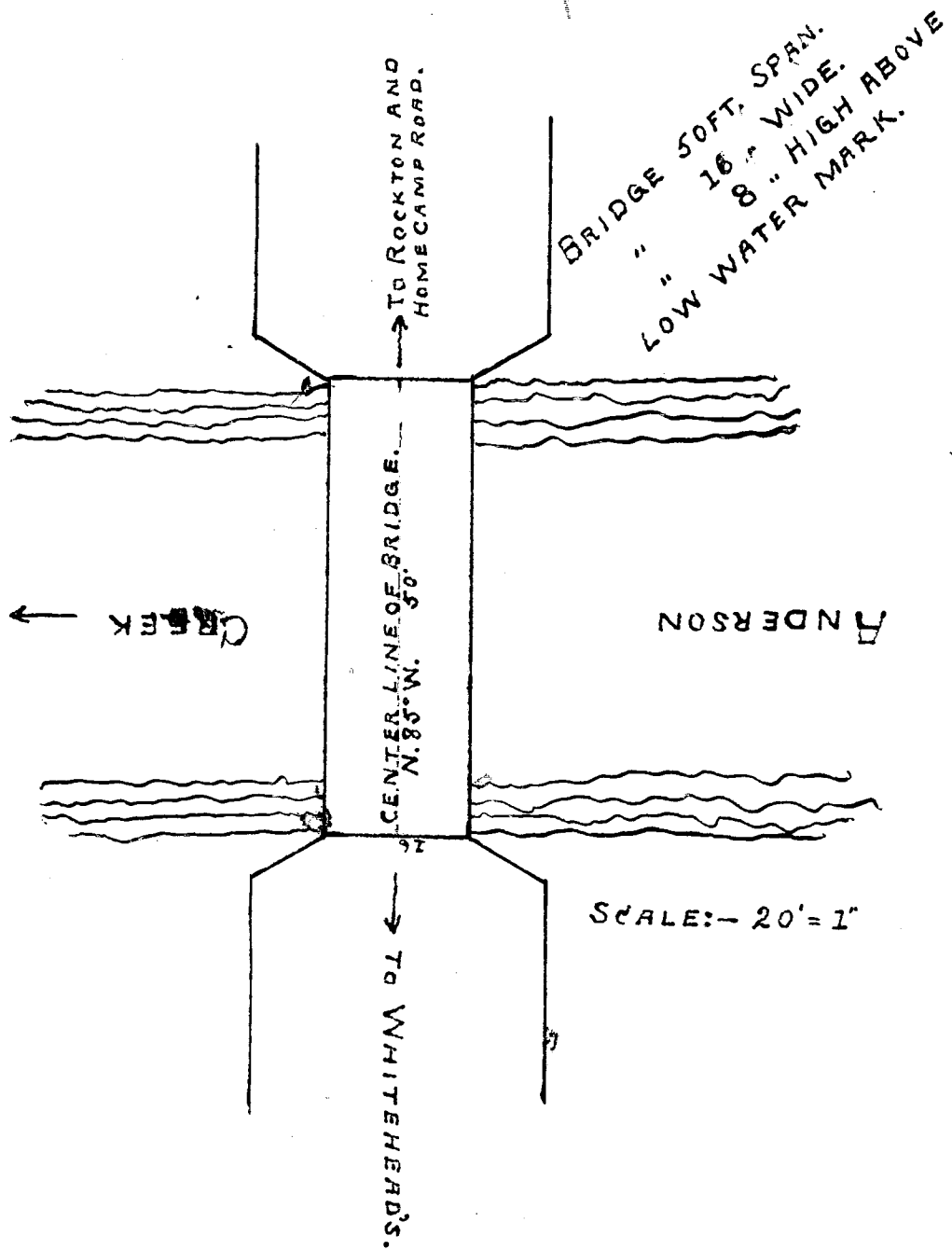
