

said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and
affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or
occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of
the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable Allison O. Smith, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

We your undersigned viewers, appointed by within order to view a Public Road in Knox Township, met in conformity with notices posted and served in accordance with the Act of assembly, and having been severally affirmed, did view and lay out for public use, a road up Potts Run, in said Township, as fol-

lows, to wit:-Beginning at a point on Carson Road to Boardman, marked "A" on

accompanying draft, on lands of Mrs. M. Bloom Est., Thence S.65°30' W.72° \$44°W. 81.5'. S.41° W.120' (50' to Caldwell line). By unimproved land of R. Caldwell S.37° W.270' (100' to Carson Run lt.) S.34°30' W.100', S.57°30' W.278', S.58°W.175.5', S.51°W.140', S.60°W.200', S.69° W.140', S.60°W.164', West, 208.5', N.76°30' W.184', N.83°30' W.115', S.84° W.167' S.80°W.320' through R. Caldwell field. S.34° W.222', S.29° W.263', S.24°30' W.664' to center of road from Caldwell's to Snyders. Still by Caldwell, S.31°15' W.205' to Ames Run. S.23° W.252', S.100', S.5° E.138', S.7°30' E.267'. (110' to Passmore line) (N.34° W. 1 S.5°E.350' through old field. S.10°E.200' S.2°E.225' S.111', S.39°30' W.558', S.8°30' W.121', S.18°30' W.472' S.16°30' W.140' to line of Carnwath Coal Co. 381' to center of Street. Thence by same, S.45° W.336' to center of road leading from New Millport to Madera. Total distance 7730 feet. A plot or draft of same being hereto annexed, and constituting a part of this report. Which road, as above laid out, is in our opinion necessary for a public road, giving water grade and shorter route for reaching the New mining town of Carnwath, said Township.

Vacating a road long laid out, but not in general use, by reason of swampy ground and excessive grade, from a point "B" on draft attached, and marked by double dotted red line as follows, to wit:- Beginning at a point on Carson Run Road leading to Boardman, 232 feet from starting point of new survey, thence N.76°W.200' N.63° W.106' N.71° W.200' N.83° W.143' to Carson Run. S.77°W.100'S 62° W.100' S.60°W.100' S.52°30' W.200' S.63W.300'S.56°30'300'S.53°30' W.300' S.43° W.400' S.38° W.277' S.15° W.100'S.30° W.300'S.44° W.200'S.55°W. 368' S.66°30' W.172' to road, Olanta &c to Madera. S.18°30' W.320'S.21° W.172' to Ames Run. Up Baker Hill, S.4° W.576' (grade 10° to 12°) S.25° W.683' S.16°30' W.187' S.20° W. 542' to Baker line. By same, S.34°E. 300'S.66° W. 400' S.62° W.900'S.48° W.400' to road leading from Carnwath to New Millport. Total vacated, 8656 feet, for the most part utterly impracticable and burdensome, and not reaching points now desired to be reached.

We therefore recommend the vacation of same, as shown by above notes, and draft hereto attached.

N. B.—If the viewers before the parties are not entitled to damages taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
