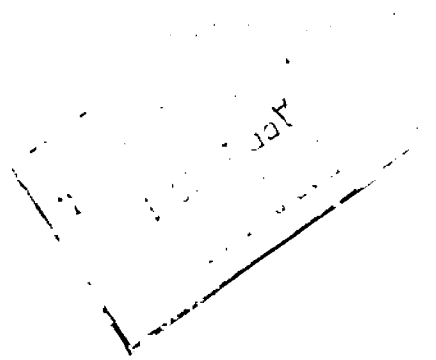

Your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road in said township of Knox, to begin at a public road in the village of Carmath in point where Buchanan Street intersects the Township road and near the store rooms of the Carmath Supply Company and extending down Poole Run to intersect a public road at the mouth of Carson Run. Said Public road leading from Boardman to the farm of Conrad Baker Estate.

Your petitioners also respectfully show that a road has long since been laid out from the village of Boardman in the

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view Vacate Supply the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McGree, Leander Hemming & William B. Mone, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We your undersigned viewers, appointed by within order to view a Public Road in Knox Township, met in conformity with notices posted and served in accordance with the Act of assembly, and having been severally affirmed, did view and lay out for public use, a road up Potts Run, in said Township, as follows, to wit:—Beginning at a point on Carson Road to Boardman, marked "A" on
