To the Hon. Allison O. Smith, Judge of said Court;

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represent:

That they ^{or certain of them} presented to your Honorable Court a petition for a public road, in the township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania (No. 2, Sept. Sessions 1909), the said road to begin in a public road leading from the Brooks place, to Cal Shaffer's at a point at the saw mill of the late M. Reasinger, and one-half mile from Eastern terminus of said road at the Brooks place, to terminate on Walnut Avenue, at the line of the Borough of DuBois, in said Township of Sandy;

That in pursuance of said petition and subsequent procedure thereon, the proposed public road was viewed, layed out, confirmed, and an opening order therefor directed to the Supervisors of Sandy Township;

That the road described in the opening order directed to the aforesaid supervisors is described as follows, to wit; BEGINNING at a public road leading from the Brooks place to Cal Shaffers, at a point near the saw mill of the late Michael Reasinger thence N. 33° 30' W. partly on improved and partly on unimproved lands of the said Michael Reasinger estate, 1989 ft. to a post on improved lands of A. R. VanTassel; thence N. 10° 15' E. still on improved lands of said A. R. VanTassel, 1372 ft. to a post at the intersection of Walnut Avenue and Eighth Street; thence N. 79° 45' W. on the central line of said Walnut Avenue, 985 ft. to a post in the line of DuBois Borough.

That the above described public road has not yet been opened or any part thereof;

That your petitioners are a majority of the petitioners on the petition to No. 2, Sept. Session, 1909.

Your petitioners conceive that the proposed public road would be useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of Sandy Township, and they therefore pray your Honorable Court that the said proposed public road may be vacated, agreeably to the acts of general assembly in such case made and provided.

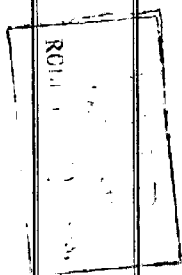

Ginter, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, ~~and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road,~~ together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, ~~and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.~~

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS.

We, the undersigned, all the viewers appointed by your Honorable Court to view and vacate a public road laid out to No. 2 September Sessions 1909, as set forth in the accompanying order respectfully report and return:

That in pursuance of said order, after having given due public notice of the time and place of meeting by posting of hand bills as required by law and serving personal notices on the property owners, through whose property said road passes, as well as on the Supervisors of Sandy Township and Commissioners of Clearfield County, (copies of which notices are hereto attached) as provided by law, all the viewers met on the 18th day of August 1911, at two o'clock in the afternoon on the public road leading from the Brooks Place to Cal Shaffer, near the saw mill of the late Michael Reasinger, one of the termini of said road, fixed in said notices as the time and place of meeting, and after first being duly sworn or affirmed, proceeded to view said road for the purposes as set forth in said order of Court.
