IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD.

The undersigned Citizens and tax payers of the Township of Beccaria, County aforesaid, respectfully represent:-

That the old wooden bridge across Turner Run on public road leading from Coalport to Flinton about one mile South of Coalport requires re-construction, and that the same should be built of concrete.

That the expense of the construction of said bridge of suitable materials is greater than the Township should bear, and the road being a much travelled public thorofare in which the whole public are interested, the same should be borne in whole or in part by the County of Clearfield.

They therefore pray that viewers may be appointed to view the premises and report to the Court what action should be taken relative thereto to the end that the same may be submitted to the Court, to the Grand Jury and to the County Commissioners for further action.

And they will ever pray.

Whereas, question has been raised whether the within confirmation absolute on terms and conditions is a proper confirmation; and

Whereas further, in case the within mentioned bridge is determined by the County Commissioners not to be a proper case for the erection of a County bridge but of an appropriation bridge, then the Act of Assembly passed the 5th day of March, 1906, requiring approval by the Court of the contract and bond, does not in terms apply.

Now, therefore, this 22nd day of March, 1912, the terms and conditions of the within confirmation absolute are hereby withdrawn and the said bridge is confirmed absolutely.

Now, February Sessions, 1912, the within Report of Viewers and approval of the Grand Jury as to the necessity of the bridge herein mentioned, and also of the fact that said bridge would be too expensive for Beccaria Township to bear alone, is hereby confirmed absolutely on the following terms and conditions:

1. That said bridge shall not be entered of record as a County bridge but as an appropriation bridge, under the Act of 1887, as amended by the Act of 1895.

2. That in order to determine the amount of appropriation which should be made by Clearfield County Commissioners towards the erection of said bridge, the said County Commissioners shall first employ an engineer who shall make plans and specifications for the same, to be reported back to the said Commissioners and to the Court, together with a careful estimate of the cost thereof, just as though the said bridge were to be built wholly by the County.

3. That after the said plans, specifications and estimates have been made, the proper amount shall be agreed upon by the County Commissioners in conjunction with the Supervisors of said ~~Union Township~~ Beccaria Township and that agreement submitted to the Court for final approval.

4. That thereafter the said bridge shall be built only after a public letting, to be joined in by the said County Commissioners and Supervisors of ^{Beccaria} ~~Union~~ Township, which bids shall also be submitted for the approval of the Court.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 28th day of September, A. D.

1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beccaria in said

County, setting forth that the old wooden bridge across Turner Run via public road leading from Coalport to Clinton about one mile south of Coalport requires re-construction and that the same should be built of concrete.

That the expense of the construction of said bridge of suitable materials is greater than the Township should bear, and the road being a much traveled public thoroughfare in which the whole public are interested the same should be borne in whole or in part by the County of Clearfield, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay the same according to law,

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. S. McCreary, Leander Derringer and

J. E. Kratter, who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.



Bridge Viewers report.

We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the Honorable Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, to view location and condition of a bridge across Gunter's Run in Beccaria Township, as per accompanying order, met this day in conformity with legal notices posted and served, and having been affirmed according to law, did view ^{at this place} the same. We find the wooden bridge in an unsafe condition, and owing to the large amount of travel by this road, a permanent, substantial bridge should at once replace it.

We therefore recommend that a monolithic reinforced concrete structure be erected 30 feet between abutments with 16 ft roadway at least 8 feet clear, in height from low water mark. In our opinion the County of Clearfield should bear the expense of such a bridge, and the Township of Beccaria the expense of filling the approaches, draft below 200 ft =, incl.
