



, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under inconvenience for want of a road to begin at a point on the road near John Titee Barn on the road from McGees to Punxsautawney 4562 from intersection of said McGee-Punxsautawney road with road leading from said road to Susquehanna River and extending to a point near 47th transitory house on the road leading from ~~McGees~~^{Newtonburg} to Punxsautawney 5320 feet from intersection of said Newtonburg-Punxsautawney road with road leading from McGees to Punxsautawney.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McCleery, Green W. Bell and James M. Weaver who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



Road Viewers' report, to No 5, December 25 1911.

To the Honorable A.O. Smith, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County:-

We the undersigned viewers appointed by Your Honor, to view and lay out a public road in Bell Township, said County, as set forth in accompanying order, met this day in conformity with notices legally posted and served, and having been duly affirmed according to law, have viewed and laid out for public use, the following road, to wit:- Beginning at a point on the public road leading from Newtonburg to Punxsutawney, near the buildings of F.F. Frampton, thence through improved land of said Frampton, S.10°W.315 feet to post, S.23°30'E.133 feet (86.3' to line of V.A. Miller). Thence through woodland of V.A. Miller, S.17°E.91.2 feet, to post. Thence S.77 feet to Cherry. Thence S.14° E.87 ft S.5° E.66.5 ft to branch of Whiskey Run. Thence across run S.8° W.67 ft, S.15° W.163 ft to point 16.5 ft from line of H.L. Mott, thence S.55° W. 146 ft, S.71°W. 141 ft, West, 218 ft, N.75° W.73 ft, S.84° W.170 ft, West, 93 ft, N.87° W.140 ft to post, thence S.10° W.30 ft to line of Geo Miller. Thence along said line, S.35° E.212 feet to center of private lane. Thence by same S.35° W. across Geo Miller 1078 ft to line of John Vite. Thence still by lane across Vite, S.47° W.1175 ft to the public road leading from McGee's Mills to Punxsutawny near Jno Vite's barn, and at intersection of road to Sidney with Punxy road. Total distance- 4676 feet.

We find no opposition to the opening of this road, and that the greater part of the route selected has been used by common consent as a private road, only changing same where the grade is excessive. Further we find that this road constitutes the only means of outlet for about eight families, to Church and School. We therefore are of the opinion that said road as laid out is a necessity, and recommend its being opened as a public road.

Draft attached, is a part of our report.
