IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENN'A.

The Petition of the undersigned Citizens of Lawrence Township, in said County, respectfully represent:-

That by reason of recent floods a bridge on the public road at a point where said public road crosses Clearfield Creek at Dimeling, said bridge being on the dividing line between Boggs and Lawrence Townships was destroyed. That the span at that point is about 70 feet and that in the opinion of your petitioners it is a useless and unnecessary expense to attempt to re-build an ordinary wooden structure and that said bridge should be built of concrete or other permanent material, the expense of which is greater than the Townships alone should be called upon to bear. That said bridge should be re-built as a County bridge or as a bridge to which aid should be extended by the County to the Townships in its construction.

They therefore pray that viewers may be appointed to view the premises and report to the Court as to the propriety of the construction of said bridge and of what materials, and also, whether it should be construction as County bridge or as a bridge receiving County aid.

And they will ever pray.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 30 day of December, A. D. 1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence in said County, setting forth that by reason of recent floods a bridge on the public road at a point where said public road crosses Clearfield Creek at Dimeling said bridge being on the dividing line between Boggs and Lawrence Townships was destroyed. That the span at that point is about 70 feet, and that in the opinion of your petitioners it is a useless and unnecessary expense to attempt to rebuild an ordinary wooden structure, and that said bridge should be built of concrete or other permanent material. The expence of which is greater than the Township alone should be called upon to bear. That said bridge should be built as a County Bridge or a bridge to which aid should be extended, by the County to the township.


and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McGreery, John W. Barraett, and Leander Denning,

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and building of said bridge in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly, do assess their damages and make report thereof as follows:



TO the Honorable Allison O. Smith, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

We the viewers appointed by your Honor to view the place for proposed bridge, mentioned in attached order, report, that your viewers met in conformity with legal notices of such meeting, were duly sworn, and did view the same this 5th day of February, 1912. We fully believe a bridge at or near this point, across "Little Clearfield Creek" to be a necessity, being on a public highway, and the means of reaching the R.R. siding from the old State road. That said bridge should be a permanent structure, of reinforced concrete, monolithic arch form; and that the expense of constructing same should be borne by Clearfield County, the Townships of Boggs and Lawrence filling the approaches.

We beg to report further, - that in our opinion, the location of present temporary bridge and the road, is not the best one, for the following reasons, the low nature of the ground, the close proximity of the "Big Creek", the necessity of crossing 4 tracks at dangerous places, to reach siding, a high bridge and long, deep fill to get above high water, and a span of 70 to 80 feet, to answer conditions at this point; that by locating bridge some 500 feet further up stream a much better site is secured, out of the way of the R.R., requiring a span of not to exceed 60 feet, with easy and natural approaches, with but one track to cross, at grade, and in the open. The grading of a road to this suggested site, would be attended with much less expense to the Townships, than to make the necessary fills at the old location, and as we are informed, meet the approval of the N.Y.C. R.R. Co. That the change of location of the road, would properly come under the Act of Assembly, of May 5, 1911, relative to changing location of roads, without view. Draft below, a part of this report.



.. PETITION OF THE SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BECCARIA RESPECTFULLY
REPRESENTS-

That they deem it advisable to construct, change and alter a part of the Public Road under their supervision situate in the Township of Beccaria, County of Clearfield, State of Pennsylvania, being a part of the Township Road leading from Coalport to St. Lawrence and have agreed with the property owners affected by such change as to damages.

That the owners of the land so affected are Goldie Oshel and C. A. Lambert and the costs of the change and alteration including the damages is less than \$300.00.

That the said part of said Road so changed begins at a point 150 feet from Spring Run and extends to a point opposite, ^{road} running to the farm house of Frank Eckard. The course and distance of the said part changes the course and distance as located by your petitioners together with a plan of the grades being presented on the map accompanying this petition.

In the matter of the proposed change of Road in Beccaria Township.

Now this 7th day of February, A. D., 1912 the petition of the Supervisors of Roads of the Township of Beccaria setting forth the facts of the proposed change of road accompanied by map of such proposed change having been presented to the Court of Quarter Sessions for approval before such change is made and it further appearing that the Supervisors have agreed with the property owners to such change as to damages and further appearing that the costs and expenses including damages is less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and it further appearing that the Supervisors deem it advisable to make such change:

upon due consideration by the Court the new location is approved, to wit:- From a point one hundred fifty (150) feet from Spring Run, thence South $47^{\circ} 45'$ West five hundred eighty-three (583) feet, thence

South 38° West one hundred forty-seven (147) feet; thence South $48^{\circ} 15'$ West one hundred sixty-four (164) feet; thence South 40° West one hundred eighty-nine (189) feet; thence South 40° West one hundred eighty (180) feet; thence South 67° West one hundred seventeen (117) feet; thence South 38° West one hundred twenty-five (125) feet; thence South 38° West two hundred sixty (260) feet to point opposite to road running to farm house of Frank Eckard, which road shall be taken and deemed to be the public road to all intents and purposes and the old location to

wit:- South $10^{\circ} W$ one hundred seventy-four feet; thence South 27° West two hundred (200) feet; thence South 46° West six hundred twenty-nine (629) feet; thence South 48° West five hundred (500) feet; thence South 71° West two hundred seventy (270) feet shall be taken and deemed to be vacated.


