At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 13 day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred Thirteen,

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Sandy

in said County, setting forth that The Bridge a wooden structure in the Township Road Over Sandy Creek at Sabula, in said Twp. is in such a condition as is deemed unsafe and that a new structure will be required

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the ~~road~~^{Bridge} between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers Walter Welch W. S. MacMinn & E. H. Harmon who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said ~~road~~^{Bridge}, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a ~~road~~^{Bridge} and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public ~~or private~~^{Bridge} road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements ~~through~~ which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said ~~road~~^{Bridge} at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the ~~road~~ may be preserved within that limit, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said ~~road~~^{Bridge} shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court or Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said ~~road~~^{Bridge}, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Sandy and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 25th day of March

A. D 1913, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., ~~which was deemed unnecessary by all parties interested.~~

~~That~~ That all of the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned ~~road~~ bridge, and that there were present at the view George Beers and George Brown two of the Supervisors of Sandy Township, also W. W. Cole one of the adjoining land owners, there were also present five citizens of the township whose names were not ascertained

not parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., ~~on the day of 1913 when the following appearances were noted:~~ for the reason that none of the parties interested desired or deemed it necessary to incur the additional expense necessary

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is occasion for a ~~road~~ bridge as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is very necessary, ~~for a road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property and as far as practicable necessary to the interest of the petitioner, and do return for the following described road, to-wit: Beginning~~

That we find the old bridge is in a dilapidated condition and a menace to the safety of the traveling public, as the abutments have given way and are held in place temporarily by the use of rough poles placed across the creek, and that the bridge and abutments are in grave danger of being carried away at any time and that in its present condition is a serious danger to the Township from liability for damages resulting from accidents. We further find that the bridge cannot be repaired except at about the same cost of replacing it new.

We are of the opinion that the cost of replacing the old bridge with a new one is more than the Township of Sandy should bear and recommend that Clearfield County pay two-thirds (2/3) of the cost of building a new bridge and Sandy Township one-third (1/3) the cost.

We would further recommend that the bridge be a concrete or stone structure, about sixteen feet long and sixteen feet wide in the clear, and that the arch be ten feet in the clear above low water mark.

and that a plan or draft of said ^{bridge} ~~road~~ showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, ~~said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting:~~

~~when it was not practicable to preserve it within that limit.~~

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by the reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows:
