CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 22^d day of *June* A. D. 1864 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Bruceville* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *the farm of*

John Foy's on road leading from *New Washington* to *Plattsville* to intersect a public road leading to *Cherrytree* at *Joseph Brothers*.

Say whether Damages are Claimed
and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *Amos Foy, Daniel Brickley, & Horace Patchin*

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

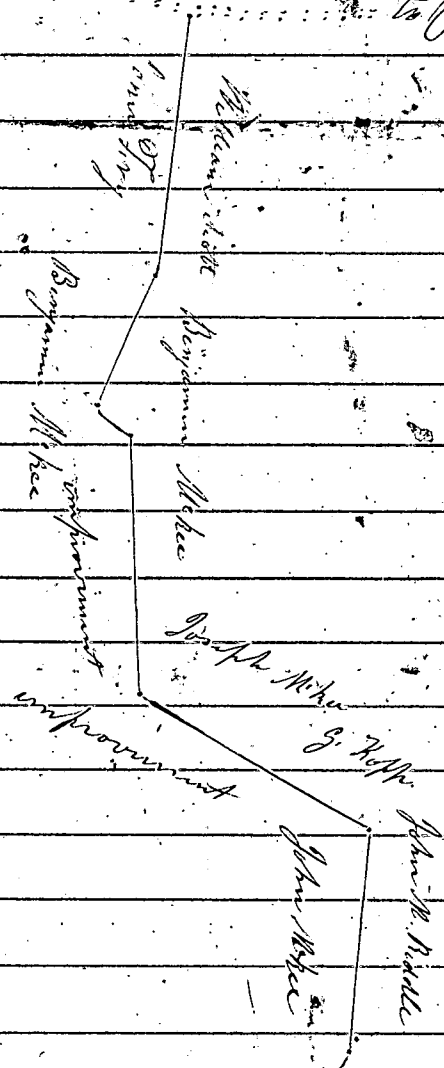

to view and lay out the road therein mentioned having
been duly sworn according to law do report that in pursuance
of the said Order we have viewed laid out and return for
public use the following road to wit: Beginning at the public
road leading from New Washington to Plattsville thence along
a line of John Frys Land North Eighty Eight Degrees west one
Hundred and five rods to said Frys Stone Corner Thence on land
of Benjamin McKee North Sixty Eight Degrees west fifty six rods
to a post near said McKees House thence South forty Degrees west
seventeen rods to a pine stump thence South Eighty four Degrees
west one Hundred and five rods to a post on land of Joseph McKee
near his house Thence South twenty six and Quarter Degrees west
one Hundred and nine rods to George Hopps S.W. post Corner
thence along John McKees and John Mc Riddle Land line North
Eighty Eight Degrees west ninety rods to a post Thence North Sixty
three Degrees west seventeen perches to a rock Thence to and along
