ALL IS IN ORDER

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the Tenth day of April. in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred Thirteen.
The Hon Allison O Smith. P.J.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Sandy.

in said County, setting forth that The Citizens of the Said Sandy Township in said Co. labor under great inconvenience for the want of a Road, or High way, to lead from the Public Highway or Road in sandy Twp commonly known as "Dixon Avenue" at A point near the residence of Grant Kirtzbauer. to point in public road leading from Du Bois, to Luthersburg. and commonly known as South Brady" St. near the residence of Mrs. Elizabeth Shea. all the proposed roads in Sandy Township.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers H.B.Woodward. H.S.Mac Minn. and E.H.Harmon.

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Sandy and that five notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 25th day of April, A. D. 1913, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the _____ day of _____, 191____, at _____ o'clock M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view the supervisors of Sandy Township and various of the petitioners,

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the _____ day of _____ A. D. 191____, when the following appearances were noted: That several witnesses were examined at the time of said view as to the necessity for said road. That owing to certain questions as to the location of property lines, it was necessary to hold an adjourned hearing, and this was held on the ground on Saturday, May 3rd at 2:00 P. M., of which due notice was given at the time of the view.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the centre of the Public Highway known as "Dixon Avenue", near the residence of Grant Kirtzbauer, thence south seventy four degrees ten minutes west ($574^{\circ} 10' W$) by Hurland Avenue, (50' wide), of a plan of Lots known as "Wilson Terrace", eighty five feet (85') to the intersection of the centre line of "Wilson Avenue" (60' wide), thence by said Avenue South fifteen minutes west ($S. 0^{\circ} 15' W$) fourteen hundred eighty five and eight tenths feet (1485.8') to the centre line of "Pentz Alley", at the southerly end of the Wilson Terrace plot of lots, thence north eighty nine degrees forty minutes east ($N. 89^{\circ} 40' E$.) along the centre line of said Alley, three hundred fifty two and one half feet, (352.5') to the centre line of the Public road leading from Du Bois to Luttersburg, commonly known as south Brady street. Said Pentz Alley, lying alongside and adjoining the south end of the Wilson Terrace plan of Lots and the lot of Mrs Elizabeth Shea, is recommended by said Viewers, to be made twenty three and six tenths feet in width (23.6'), to conform to a space laid open for an alley way, for said Public Road or Highway. A total length of nineteen hundred twenty three and three tenths feet (1923.3).

The said road had already been dedicated to the public use by the owners of adjoining land at the time when the plot known as Wilson Terrace was laid out in building lots.

We recommend to the Court that a public road be opened of a width of Fifty (50) feet from Dixon Avenue to the intersection with Wilson

Avenue along what is known as Martland Avenue; that the road be laid out a width of Sixty (60) feet along Wilson Avenue to the point of intersection with Pentz Alley; that the road be laid out a width of Twenty-three and six-tenths (23.6) feet along Pentz Alley between Wilson Avenue and South Brady Street.

All of which is in accordance with and more specifically set forth upon the draft hereunto attached and made a part of this report.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting

when it was not practicable to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by the reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows:

ORDER

Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
