To the Honorable Allison O. Smith,

Judge of the said Court,

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents:

(1) That each of the subscribers hereto is a freeholder in the Township of Lawrence in the said County.

(2) That said subscribers A.B. Weaver, T.L. Welles and Ruth R. Ettla being the private owners of a certain tract of land in the said Township of Lawrence did lay out and plot on a map thereof certain lanes, alleys, highways and roads, and did put of record in the office for recording deeds, etc., in and for said Clearfield County a copy of the said plot, the same having been recorded in Miscellaneous Book No. 7 page 366.

(3) That all the lanes, alleys, highways and roads shown on the said plot as being on that part thereof to the north of the southern boundary line of Bowman Street as extended from its easternmost terminus in a westerly direction across Twenty First Street to the western boundary line of said Twenty First Street have become useless to the public and those having lands bounding thereon by reason of (a) being steep and not laid out or marked on the ground, (b) never having been used, (c) of no prospective use, (d) the construction and maintenance of which would be a wasteful expenditure of money, (e) it would be beneficial to all the freeholders and residents of the vicinity to not have the said lanes, alleys, highways and roads laid out as the construction of them would serve no useful purpose for anyone.

(4) That all persons having interests and rights, or either of them, in the said lanes, alleys, highways and roads have joined in this petition.

Wherefore your petitioners pray that said lanes, alleys, roads and highways be closed up and vacated; and respectfully request that a rule be granted on all persons interested therein to show cause why the same should not be done, the said rule to be published once a week for four weeks in a newspaper of the County.

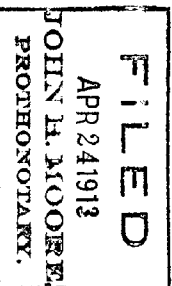

To the Honorable Allison O. Smith,  
Judge of the said Court:

Now this 16th day of May A.D. 1913  
Murray & O'Laughlin, Attorneys of record for the petitioners for  
the vacation of certain lanes, alleys, highways and roads in Law-  
rence Township, which proceeding to vacate was brought to No. 10  
May Sessions 1913 do hereby move the Court for permission to amend  
the petition filed on the 24th day of April 1913 by striking out  
of paragraph (3) thereof the words "north of the southern boundary  
line of Bowman Street as extended from its easternmost terminus in  
a westerly direction across Twenty First Street to the western  
boundary line of said Twenty First Street" <sup>and add</sup> so as to read as follows:

"South or southwest of the southern boundary line of Bowman  
Street as extended from its westernmost terminus in an  
easterly direction across Twenty First Street to the east-  
ern boundary line of said Twenty First Street".
