To the Honorable Allison O. Smith, Judge of the said Court.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of Goshen Township, said County, respectfully sheweth that a bridge is much needed over Big Trout Run at the place where the public highway crosses the same, said highway leading from Shawsville to Eden Church, and about one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) mile from the mouth of the said Run near the old Morrow Mill. The expense of erecting and building said bridge will be too heavy and burdensome upon the inhabitants of said Township; that the said bridge is for the convenience of non-residents of said Township as well as residents, and it is not reasonable that the said Township should bear the whole of the expense thereof.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray your Honorable Court to appoint proper persons to view the premises and to make such order on the subject as is directed and required by the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided. And they will ever pray etc.


and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

We the undersigned viewers, appointed by the Court to view the place for the proposed bridge in the within order mentioned, respectfully report: That having given due legal notice to the County Commissioners and the Supervisors of Goshen Township of the time and place of meeting as per copy of said notices here-to attached as part of this report, as also to the public by four written and printed notices posted up along the public road at and near the location of said proposed bridge, stating the time and place of meeting; met at the time and place fixed in said notices to wit; at the location of said proposed bridge where the public road leading from Shawsville to the Eden Church crosses over Trout Run near the old Morrow Mill on Thursday April 16th 1914 at one (1) o'clock P M, and having been first severly sworn or affirmed and in persuance of said order viewed the premises aforesaid respectfully report. That we are of the opinion that a bridge over Trout Run at the place where the public road leading from Shawsville to the Eden Church crosses said creek is necessary as it is a road that is traveled considerable and as the bridge there now being an old wooden structure and in bad and unsaf condition, but find the butments in good condition well constructed and all right to support any kind of bridge; we would therefore recomend that a concrete bridge with reinforced roadway sixteen feet wide be build on the present butments where the public road leading from Shawsville to the Eden Church where said road crosses Trout Run in Goshen Township near the old Morrow mill about one half mile above Shawsville. ~~and~~ <sup>we further find</sup> that the erection of said bridge would be attended with more expense than it is reasonable that the said township should bear would therefore recomend that the expense of the erection of said bridge be equally divided between Goshen Township and the County.


