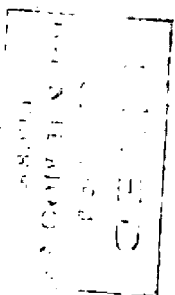

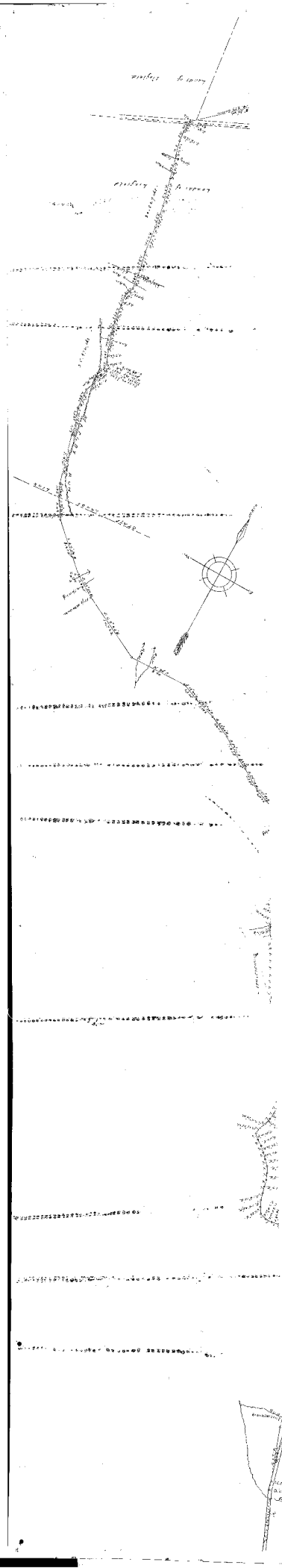

1st. Because there is now a public road that has been in use for many years between the two points named in the petition for the proposed road.

It is a good road bed and is kept in fairly good condition. Most of the heavy hauling along this distance of two or three miles is toward Penfield, and the principal hills are down grade that way. It is too much expense to build another road up this proposed Matley Hollow route, and then to maintain two roads so nearly parallel.

2nd. There is now a public road laid by order of Court, open and in use, from the starting point of the proposed new road, by two different routes to the Pennsylvania Station, and said public road extends past the depot.

3rd. There is no settlement on the proposed route, except two places, and they can be let out to the road just above named by its extension by probably less than one-fourth mile.

4th. There is no land on the proposed route that will be open for settlement. It passes through the Lixfield farm, which would be considerably damaged, then a short distance on the Coal & Coke Company unimproved land, after which all is on land of the State Forestry.

5th. We think the cost of opening and keeping up the proposed road is too great for the amount of benefit to come to the public by a second road between the two points named.

To the Honorable Singleton Bell President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield, and L.E. Boyer, H.S. McMinn and E.H. Harman, Viewers appointed by Court :

The signers hereto, citizens of Huston Township and adjoining territory, beg leave to remonstrate against the laying out and opening of a public road from a point "leading from a point on the main road from Penfield to Clearfield, at the office of the Penfield Coal & Coke Company in Huston Township, to a point on the Penfield road at what is known as the Buchheit Shanty, also in Huston Township", for the following and other reasons :

- 1st. Because there is now a public road that has been in use for many years between the two points named in the petition for the proposed road. It is a good road bed and is kept in fairly good condition. Most of the heavy hauling along this distance of two or three miles towards Penfield and the principal hills are down grade that way. It is too much expense to build another road up this proposed Matley Hollow route, and then to maintain two roads so nearly parallel.
- 2nd. There is now a public road laid by order of Court, open and in use, from the starting point of the proposed new road, by two different routes, to the Pennsylvania Station, and said public road extends past the depot.




