

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 18 day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred fourteen.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Karthaus

in said County, setting forth that a public road situate in said Township leading from or near the village of Pottersdale to what is known as the Quay Conaway place has become useless and burdensome to the taxpayers of said Township. they therefore pray you Hon Court to appoint viewers to view and vacate the same known as Israel Conaway Road

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A.G. Kramer, E.D. Billotte,

Harry Reese.

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court or Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of

Karthaus and that Three notices thereof were posted along the route of the

proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 28th day of July,

And that the public hearing supposed to be held in the Arbitration room in the Court House not being necessary was dispensed with

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for the use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning

And that after having been first severly sworn or affirmed according to the requirements of the Act of Assembly, we viewed the said road and are of the opinion that the same has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and would therefore recommend that the same be vacated as prayed for.

The said road recommended to be vacated starts at a point near Pottersdale on the public road leading from Pottersdale to Keating. Thence running through land of E. J. Gilliland Estate north 14 degrees west 120 feet, thence north 6 degrees west 300 feet, thence north 2 degrees west 500 feet, thence north 6 degrees west 200 feet, thence north 34 degrees west 200 feet, thence north 12 degrees, west 100 feet, thence north 5 degrees, west 500 feet, thence north 10-1/2 degrees west 200 feet, thence north 3 degrees, west 300 feet, thence north 14-3/4 degrees west 300 feet, thence through what is known as the Shaffer lands thence north 5 degrees west 200 feet, thence north 13 degrees, west 400 feet, thence north 11-1/4 degrees, west 500 feet, thence north 5-1/4 degrees, west 200 feet, thence through lands of the Israel Conoway estate north 5 degrees east 500 feet, thence north 9 degrees east 300 feet, thence north 11-1/4 degrees east 600 feet, thence north 5-1/2 degrees west 100 feet, thence north 9 degrees east 300 feet, thence north 2 degrees west 200 feet, thence north 5 degrees, east 180 feet to line of land of Quay Conoway and end of said road.
