TO THE HONORABLE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER  
SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY.

The petition of the undersigned supervisors of Graham Town-  
ship as also citizens of Graham Township respectfully represent;

That a certain portion of public road in said Township  
known as the Deer Creek road leading from a point at or near the  
residence of Mrs. J. S. Jury to the Deer Creek Bridge, by reason  
of its location is of such a grade as to make it very inconvenient  
for public travel as also very expensive to maintain.

Your petitioners represent that a public road could be  
laid out to begin at a point at Deer Creek Bridge and thence by  
lands of Kelly and Crider and Mrs. J. S. Jury to a point on Deer  
Creek road about three hundred feet west of residence of Mrs. J. S.  
Jury, being about one mile in length which would obviate the steep  
grade and would be less expensive to maintain and a much better  
and safer road for travel.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray the court to appoint  
viewers to vacate the said portion of the road and to supply the  
same as hereinbefore set forth.

# RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of

Graham and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the third day of September

A. D 1914 ~~and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room at the Court House in Clearfield, Pa. on the 10th day of September 1914, at 10 o'clock A.M. That~~

That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view S. W. Pace one of the Supervisors and Frank P Hubler Road master in favor of the road and

parties in interest. ~~That the hearing was held in the Arbitration room in the Court House at Clearfield, Pa. on the 10th day of September 1914, at 10 o'clock A.M. That~~

That there being no contest in the matter it was not considered necessary to hold a public hearing, the public hearing was therefore dispensed with.

After the view ~~and hearing~~ above mentioned, the undersigned, ~~the undersigned~~ viewers, do agree that there is an occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is necessary for a Public road; And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning

sundry inhabitants of the Township of

in said County, setting forth that a certain  
portion of public road in said Township known as the Deer Creek  
road leading from a point at or near the residence of Mrs. J.S.  
Jury to the Deer Creek Bridge, by reason of its location is of such  
a grade as to make it very inconvenient and for public travel  
as also very expensive to maintain. Your petitioner represent  
that a public road could be laid out to begin at a point at  
Deer Creek Bridge and thence by lands of Kelly and Crider and Mrs.  
J.S. Jury to a point on Deer Creek road about three hundred feet  
West of residence of Mrs. J.S. Jury, being about one mile in length which  
would obviate the steep grade and could be less expensive to maintain and  
much better to and safer for travel

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and  
lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon  
due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and  
among the County Board of Viewers A.G. Kramer,  
T.D. Billotte and J.S. Michaels

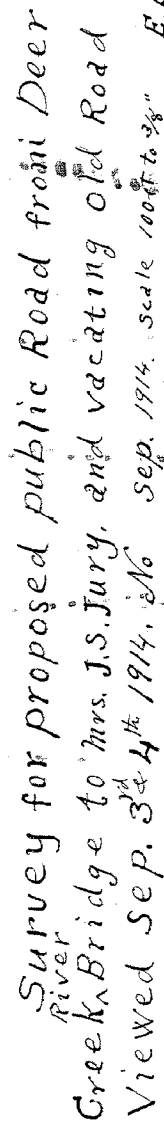
who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and  
are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impari-  
ality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground  
proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of  
the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall  
proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as  
may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest dis-  
tance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and  
shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same  
necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof,  
and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through  
which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay  
out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the  
crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the  
declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public  
road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road  
shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening  
the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their  
claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view  
the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and  
make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner  
transmit to the next Court or Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot  
aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been  
sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was  
given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and  
lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
