At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the

10 day of August, A. D. 1914

189, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike in said

County, setting forth that on one of the main traveled

roads of said Township of Pike, being a road leading from the village of Bridgeport to a point on State road near the Michael Cassidy farm, which road crosses Little Anderson Creek, at or near Rustic Station of the P.R.R. a bridge is required to be built across said Little Anderson Creek, the span of which bridge will not exceed thirty feet, as the present structure across said creek being wooden has become unsafe for travel. The Supervisors of Pike Township further assure the Court of the Absolute necessity that said new bridge should be erected.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, -

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

A.C. Krammer, Harry Reese, and J.S. Michaels

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSION OF
CLEARFIELD COUNTY PA.

We the undersigned viewers duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from among the County Board of viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court, and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows.

That notice of the time of the view was duly served according to law, upon the County Commissioners of Clearfield County and the board of Supervisors of Pike Township, and that three notices thereof were posted at or near the proposed location of said bridge setting forth that the said view would be held on Monday the 31, day of August at 11, o'clock A. M. And that the said viewers appointed by the said order, met and viewed the premises or proposed location of said bridge on the day fixed for said view, and there were present at the said view Harrison Bloom one of the Supervisors of Pike Township and John Bloom

in favor of said bridge; and after the view, (there being no opposition to said bridge) it was not considered necessary by the viewers to hold a public hearing said hearing was therefore dispensed with as the viewers having agreed that there is a need or necessity for a bridge across little Anderson Creek near Rustic Station where the public road leading from Bridgeport to where said road intersects with the State road near the Michael Cassidy farm in Pike Township crosses said creek; but that the expense of the erection of such a bridge would be greater, or more than is reasonable that the said township alone should bear.

The viewers would therefore recommend, that a ^{reinforced} concrete bridge of twelve (12) foot wide roadway of fifty (50) foot span, eight (8) feet in the clear above low water mark with substantial either stone or concrete abutments be erected at said point, at the joint expense of the county and Pike township, each bearing one half of the expense of the erection of said bridge.

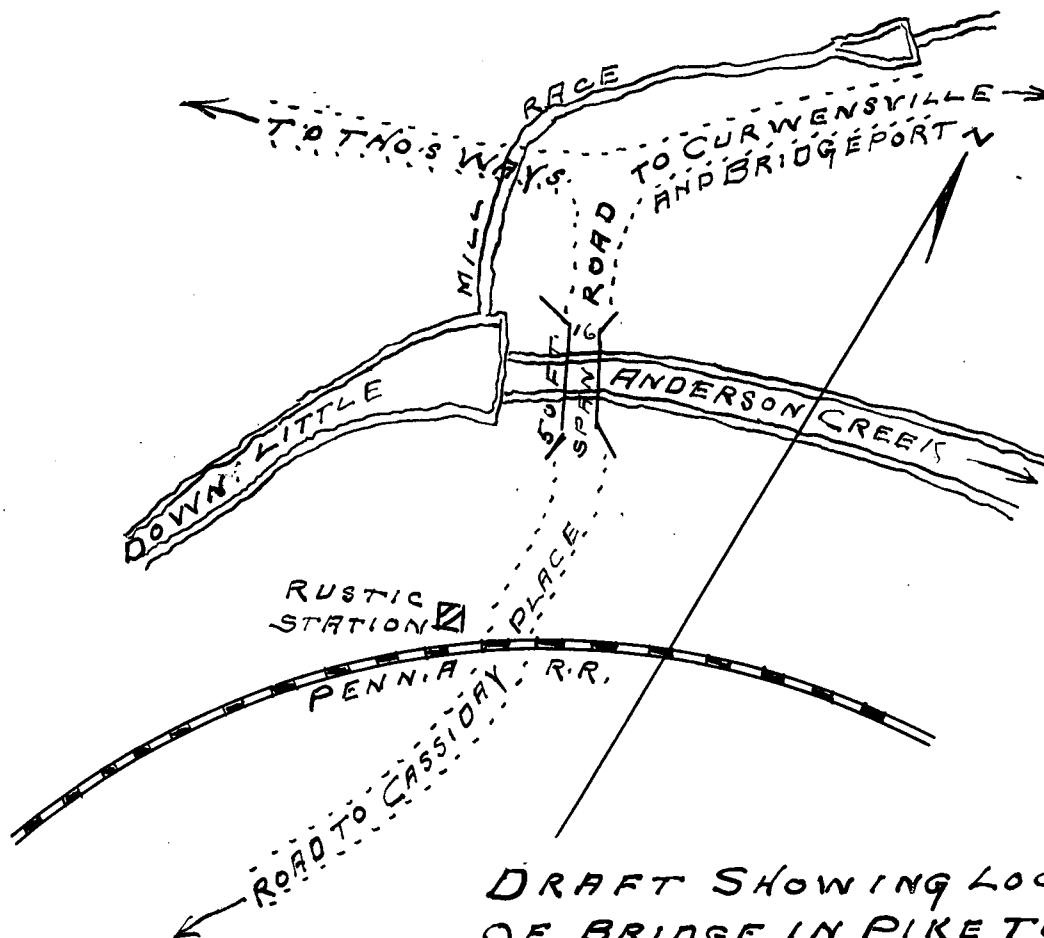
