CLEARFIELD COUNTY.

The petition of the undersigned supervisors of Pike Township, and also citizens of Pike Township, respectfully represent;

That on one of the main travelled roads of said Township of Pike, being a road leading from the village of Bridgeport to a point on State road near the Michael Cassidy farm, which road crosses Little Anderson Creek, at or near Rustic Station of the Pennsylvania Railroad, a bridge is required to be built across said Little Anderson Creek, the span of which bridge will not exceed ~~thirty~~ feet, as the present structure across said creek being wooden has become unsafe for travel.

Your petitioner, therefore, prays the Court to appoint viewrtd to view the site for said proposed bridge. The supervisors of Pike Township further assure the Court that it is absolutely necessary that said bridge (new) should be erected, and that the said Board of Supervisors have been assured by the County of Clearfield that county aid would be furnished for the erection of said bridge.



County, setting forth that on one of the main travelled roads of said Township of Pike, being a road leading from the village of Bridgeport to a point on state road near the Michael Cassidy farm which road crosses Little Anderson Creek, at or near Rustic Station of the Pennsylvania Railroad, a bridge is required to be built across said Little Anderson Creek, the span of which bridge will not exceed ~~seventy~~ feet, as the present structure across said creek being wooden has become unsafe for travel.

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. G. Kramer, Harry Reese and J. S. Michaels

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

We the undersigned viewers duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court, and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows.

That notice of the time of the view was duly served according to law, upon the County Commissioners of Clearfield County and each of the board of Supervisors of Pike Township, and three notices thereof were posted at or near the proposed location of said bridge, setting forth that the said view would be held on tuesday the 19th day of January at 11, oclock A M, and that the viewers appointed by the said order, met on the premises on the day appointed and viewed the premises or proposed location of said bridge on the day fixed for said view, and that there were present at the said view Walter Long, T H Rowles and Harrison Bloom the Supervisors of Pike Township and John Johnson all in favor of said bridge And after said view at the request of the Supervisors the day for the public hearing in compliance with the Act of Assembly and the Rules of the Court was fixed for Thursday January 28th 1915 at one (1) oclock P. M. to be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House in Clearfield Pa of which public hearing due notice was served upon the County Commissioners, and the Supervisors of Pike Township and notices posted up near the proposed location of said bridge. And that the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House at the time set to wit the 28th day of January 1915 at one (1) oclock P, M, when the following parties appeared as witnesses in favor of said bridge to wit Walter Long, T H Rowles and Harrison ^{Bloom} Straw the Supervisors of Pike Township, and C F Hays, Chas K Spencer, Chas Anderson, Geo W Anderson & A I Bloom all of Pike Township And after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned viewers do agree that there is a need or necessity for a bridge across Little Anderson Creek near Rustic Station where the public road, leading from the village of Bridgeport to where said road intersects with the State road near the Michael Cassidy farm in Pike Township crosses said creek; but that the expense of the erection of said bridge including the abutments will be about \$2000.00 which is greater or more then is reasonable that said township should bear.

The viewers would therefore recommend, that a one span Iron bridge of fifty foot span with a 12 foot wide roadway, with iron eyebeam girders and a creosote block roadway with either concrete or good stone abutments be erected at the place designated at a cost or expense of about two thousand (\$2000.00) dollars at the joint expense of the County and Pike Township.
