

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF
THE PEACE OF THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD PA.

we the undersigned viewers duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court, and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows.

That notice of the time of the view was duly served according to law, upon the County Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Chief Burgess and the President of the town Council of the Borough of Glen Hope, and that three notices thereof were posted up, one at each end of said bridge and the other in a public place along the street on which said bridge is located in said borough, that the view would be held on the 30th day of March A. D. 1915 at 9 o'clock A. M. whereupon the said viewers appointed by the said order viewed the location of the said proposed bridge and that there were present at the view Clarence Bloom the Burgess of said borough and H. M. Pentz, William Groom, L A Stiles, Robert Herdman, Jonas Croyl, William Rummery, J G Gilligan, M. D. Rummery, Charles Haines, Arthur Herdman, all interested in and in favor of said bridge.

That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House in Clearfield Pa on Thursday the 15th day of April 1915, no one appearing either for or against the same. And that after the view and hearing above mentioned the said viewers do agree that there is a necessity for a new bridge across Clearfield Creek in the borough of Glen Hope where the street which connects with the public road leading from the borough of Glen Hope to the Village of Janesville crosses said Creek, to replace the old wooden structure now there, erected in 1848 sixth seven years ago which in the opinion of the viewers is in an unsafe condition by reason of some of the under timbers being rotten and the abutments giving way and on account of age the entire structure being in a dilapidated and unsafe condition.

They would therefore recommend, that a one span iron bridge of one hundred and ten (110) feet in length, sixteen (16) feet wide in the clear with iron eyebeam girders and a creosote block road way, with either concrete, or stone laid in cement mortar abutments fifteen feet in height above low water mark on solid foundations be erected at a total cost of not more than six thousand (\$6000.00) dollars and on account of the borough of Glen Hope not being financially able to contribute anything towards the erection thereof that the same be erected by the County. The old wooden bridge there now being a county bridge.


