The petition of the undersigned Supervisors of Ferguson Township, as also sundry citizens and taxpayers of said Township, respectfully represents:-

That upon a certain public road in said Township, which is known as the "Ridge Road" leading from the Village of Kerrmoor to Fruit Hill is a bridge across Little Clearfield Creek; that said road has been a public road for upwards of thirty-five years and that said bridge has become unfit and unsafe for travel.

Your petitioners further represent that in their opinion a new bridge across said Creek is an absolute necessity; that said road is a greatly travelled road.

Your petitioners further represent that the Township of Ferguson is financially unable to build said bridge and therefore require County aid, and do most respectfully pray the Court to appoint viewers to view said proposed bridge and make report thereon to the Court.

Return of Viewers.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield, Pa.

We the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court, and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, Pa., beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and on each member of the Board of Supervisors of Ferguson Township, and that Three (3) notices thereof were posted along the public road at and near the location of said bridge, giving notice that the view would be held on Tuesday the Thirteenth day of June A. D. 1916, at one (1) o'clock P. M. ~~BY THE SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FERGUSON~~

And that the said viewers met at _____ the site or proposed location of said bridge, where the public road leading from Kerrmoor in Ferguson Township to the Fruit Hill in Jordan Township on Tuesday the thirteenth day of June A. D. 1916 at one (1) o'clock P. M. and that there were present at the view L. J. Hile and Robert McCracken two of the Supervisors of Ferguson Township and J. G. McGreery, Jacob Dutra and Orange Michaels

parties interested for said bridge.

And that the said viewers all having been present at the view and after having made said view do agree that there is a necessity for said bridge, to replace the old wooden structure there now, which is in an unsafe and dilapidated condition, and therefore recommend; that a double reinforced concrete bridge; Thirty two (32) feet in length, with a driveway sixteen (16) feet in width, nine (9) feet above low water mark on solid reinforced concrete, or stone abutments laid in cement mortar resting on solid bottom, be erected at said point where the public road leading from Kerrmoor in Ferguson Township to Fruit Hill in Jordan Township crosses little Clearfield Creek near Kerrmoor. as per draft attached as part of our report. And that in the opinion of the viewers the cost or expense of the erection of said bridge including the abutments will be about sixteen hundred (\$1600.00) Dollars; and as said amount owing to the financial condition of the township would be to heavy and burdensome upon the said township alone to bear. They would therefore recommend, that one half of the cost or expense of the erection of said bridge be paid by the County and the remainder by Ferguson Township.




