Borough of Chester Hill. The New York Central Railroad Company maintains a freight station in said Borough of Chester Hill from which station all freight consigned to Philipsburg Borough, Chester Hill Borough, South Philipsburg Borough, Rush Township, Centre County and Decatur Township, Clearfield County is distributed. All persons having to do with the transportation of such freight testified without exception that any other route than the route of the proposed bridge would not only be exceedingly inconvenient for them but would greatly increase their expense, which in this day, we well understand will be borne by the individual consumer of their goods.

The Council of the Borough of Chester Hill have all signed a statement which was produced to the joint meeting of the viewers stating and declaring that if the relief sought in the way of a bridge is granted that they will see that the street now opened is extended so as to connect with some other throughfare already designated as a public road. Surely this Board is justified in assuming that these men of affairs in Chester Hill Borough are sincere and will do as they say they will do. Of this, the Board appointed by your Honorable Court has no doubt whatever. Even though this were not a fact the street is opened to the tracks of the New York Central Railroad and sufficient necessity has been shown for the bridge.

The Board therefore recommends that an intercounty bridge be built at the point designated in the order of the following nature and character:- Iron super-structure sixteen feet wide sixty feet in length concrete abutments with wing walls the super-structure to have a carrying strength sufficient for the crossing of a steam roller at a cost of about thirty-five hundred dollars.

The Board further finds that the cost and expense of building a bridge at this point would be greater than the Boroughs of Chester Hill and Philipsburg could bear and that such would be imposing an undue burden upon them.

The Board desires to note in conclusion that Messrs Heney, Spenser and Dale, County Commissioners of Clearfield County were present at the hearing/

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of your Board of Viewers hereon, do agree that there is occasion for a county (inter-county) bridge as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary. It appears to the viewers that none of the inter-county bridges now existent in the vicinity of the location sought by the petition are in any manner adequate for the accomodation of the travel between the counties of Centre and Clearfield and in view of the great natural resources of Clearfield County lying adjacent to Centre County, as well as in view of the fact that all the residents of Chester Hill Borough, and Decatur Township, in Clearfield County are dependent upon Centre County for aid and assistance in the supply of food stuffs, doctor's attention, burial, and all of the other essentials of society, we feel that our attitude would be exceedingly reactionary were we not to recommend an inter-county bridge at this point.

Much has been made of the fact that from the testimony offered to the viewers there has been nothing to show that the Borough of Chester Hill has never by ordinance dedicated a street at or near the proposed bridge. The testimony does show however that such a street has been dedicated by grant and has been opened and used for public travel for many years and that the Borough of Chester Hill has regarded the same as a street and has done work thereon. There can be no doubt but that the street known as Pine Street, in the Borough of Philipsburg, is opened as a public street in the Borough of Chester Hill, at least as far as the tracks of the New York Central Railroad, a considerable distance from the end of the proposed bridge and along a route passing some of the largest and most prosperous places of business in the said

The viewers of Centre County consider that an inter county ~~bridge~~ bridge (as appears by a copy of their report hereto attached), necessary at that point, while the viewers from Clearfield County are not convinsed of the necessity of a bridge at that point for the following reasons.

FIRST: Because there is no public road or laid out street on the Clearfield County side of the proposed new bridge, as required by law, for the erection of an inter county bridge, and therefore no access to the said bridge except over the right of way of the New York Central Railroad, which may be closed up at any time by the said Railroad Company.

SECOND: Because they already have <sup>two</sup> substantial bridges across said creek between said boroughs, a Concrete bridge on the State road leading from Osceola through Chester Hill into Philipsburg; and the other, an inter county Iron bridge on Presqueille street the main street, thoroughfare between said two boroughs which runs right past both railroad stations of the N. Y. C. and the Penna Railroads which is only about six hundred feet further up the creek then the proposed new inter county bridge and the Concrete bridge is only about four hundred feet above the said Iron bridge on Presqueille street so that in the opinion of the viewers said boroughs are already well supplied with bridges sufficient



to supply their wants and the wants of the traveling public; and for the further reason that there is no way to get into said proposed bridge except right past the end of the inter County Iron bridge on Presqueille Street and from there right over the right of way of the New York Central Railroad Company some six hundred feet to the proposed location of the new bridge, which right of way may be closed up at any time by the said Railroad Company and the travel to the proposed new bridge if build be entirely shut off; besides the end of the proposed bridge on the Philipsburg side will if build be right up against the tracts of the Pennsylvania Railroad and will therefore make a dangerous grade crossing:-

The viewers are therefore of the opinion that there is not sufficient reason or necessity for said bridge to warrant them in reporting in favor of an inter County Bridge and therefore report against the same

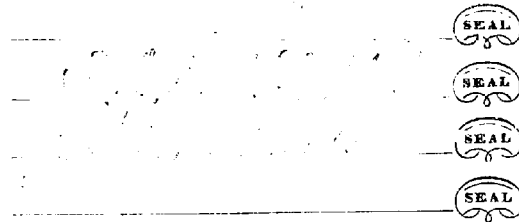
