Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Beccaria and Borough of Coalport

in said County, setting forth that the petitioners

labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to begin in the borough of Coalport, at a point on the public road from Coalport of Flynton in the borough of Coalport, about fifty feet south of Blain Run Bridge at or near the residence of Frank Flickengar, and to run thence through said Borough and the Township of Beccaria, to a point in the public road from Utalville to Blair City, about one hundred feet south of the crossing of the Ellwood Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad in said Twp. of Beccaria.

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. REMONSTRANCE.

To the Hon. the Judge of the court of quarter sessions of the peace, of Clearfield County.
 Whereas your remonstrants are aware that a petition and view for a public road or highway to lead from or beginning in Coalport borough, at a point on the public road leading from Coalport to Utahville, and thence, in the borough of Coalport, about 50 feet South of Blain Run Bridge, at or near residence of Frank Plickinger in said borough, to run thence through small portion of said borough and the township of Neccaria, to a point in the public road from Utahville to Blain City, about 100 feet South of crossing of P. & W. R.R. in said town.

Whereas the Hon. Court has appointed the necessary viewers to view and locate said road, for which the inhabitants and tax payers of Neccaria township, solemnly protest against the building and construction of said road, or its confirmation by the Hon. 
