IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNA.

To the Honorable Singleton Bell,
President Judge of the said Court:

We, the undersigned citizens of Goshen Township, respectfully represent:-

That a road has long since been laid out in our Township from a point near Goshen Church on the road leading from Goshen Church to Shawesville, known as the road to Wapes' Mill, and that a part of said road at a point near the barn on the Shirey Place to the terminal of said road, which terminal is not known definitely, but is about a mile from the Shirey Place, is now become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and is abandoned for public use, and they, therefore, pray the Court that the said road may be vacated agreeable to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

And they will ever pray.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 12 day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventeen,

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Goshen

in said County, setting forth that a road has long

~~since been laid out in out Township from a point near Goshen Church on the road leading from Goshen Church to Shawville known as the road to Mapes Mill, and that a part of said road at a point near the barn on the Shirey Place to the terminal of said road, which terminal is not known definitely, but is about a mile from the Shirey place, is now become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and is abandoned for~~

~~public use, and they, therefore, pray the Court that the said road may be vacated agreeable to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided,~~

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer Esq., E. D. Billotte and J. S. Michaels

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view ~~the road and lay out~~ ^{the road} for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is ~~occasion~~ ^{vacation} for ~~such~~ road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the destination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

~~And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments, which report they shall in like manner present to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing~~

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Goshen and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the third day of April A. D. 1917, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 2d day of April, 1917, at 9 o'clock A. M. That the said viewers appointed by the said order viewed the road proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view W. R. Shirey, Thomas Taylor Ira Tate two of the Supervisors of said Township;

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Court Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 5th day of April A. D. 1917, when the following appearances were noted: John Sipe, Otis Knapp, and Frank Gilliland, with others who were not called as witnesses with their Attorney J. J. Pentz, opposed to vacating the road and Thomas Taylor and Ira Tate two of the Supervisors of said Township with their Attorney Hazzard, A. Murray Esq. in favor of vacating said road

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, ~~the majority of the said~~ viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for said ~~road as desired by the petitioners~~ road and that the same is no longer necessary for a public road; And having had respect to the short distance and the best ground for such road we have had ~~no shall do the least injury to private property, and we have had~~ agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for do vacate the following described road Beginning at the barn of W. R. Shirey in Goshen Township to what used to be Mapes Mill the terminus of said road in said Township that said road between said points has in the opinion of the viewers on account of the limited amount of travel thereon between said points become useless and will therefore be a useless bill of expense to put and keep said road in proper repair, and might therefore in case of an accident involve the township in a bill of cost and damages and as said saw mill has long since been abandoned; there is no cleared land of any account and no settlement beyond the residence of the said W. R. Shirey or buildings of any kind except the Crooked Run hunting and fishing camp which is over a mile beyond the terminus of said road which said hunting and fishing club is composed of some forty members, principally residents of Clearfield Town, none of which are residents of or taxpayers of Goshen Township. And as the viewers understand the law, a hunting and fishing camp is not such a necessity as to require a district to construct or maintain a public road when not used for any other purpose; but for hunting, fishing and gathering berries. Chief Justice Black in defining what constitutes the necessity for a public road in the extension of Second Street in Columbia 11 Harris page 346; as follows; The necessity for a public road to be; anything that will prevent a portion of the people from getting to market; to Church; or other places where men are in the habit of meeting on their lawful business or in pursuance of their proper duties. And in the Pikeland Road case Pa Rep No 63 page 474 Justice Sharswood refers to the former case as being the law.

It has also been decided: that a Church, where people gather in sacred worship; a School House which is for the children of all the people in the community also a Cemetery which is public for all people residing in the community and a Railroad Station also a public resort for people wishing to travel; but no where as far as the viewers have any knowledge has it ever been decided, that a pleasure resort or a hunting and fishing camp or any other private institution kept up simply for the benefit of its own member is such a necessity that it can be made the terminal of a public road. So that the viewers take it that any public road no longer necessary for the accomodation of the public at large can be vacated.

And as the Crooked Run hunting and fishing camp is a private institution gotten up and maintained by its members for their exclusive use and benefit, it does not come within the rules laid down that constitute a necessity for the terminus of a public road.

The viewers are therefore of opinion that said road ^{from} W. R. Shireys barn to what used to be Mapes Mill the terminus of said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the taxpayers of the township and would therefore recommend that the same be vacated:

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting—

when it was not practicable to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from ~~opening~~ the same, and that they procured such releases from

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by the reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows: No Damages Assessed

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

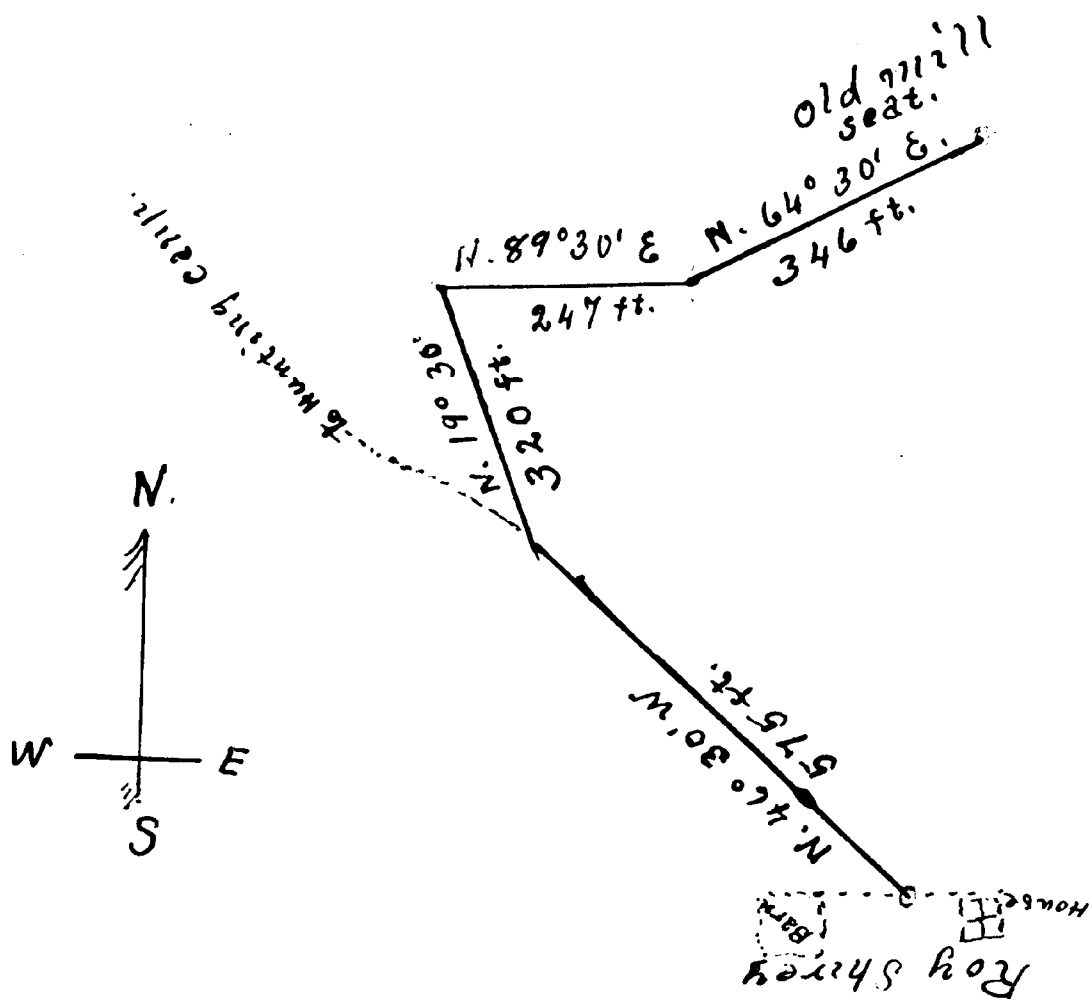
