IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PA.

To the Honorable the President Judge of said Court:-

The petition of the undersigned citizens and residents of the township of Pike in the county of Clearfield, respectfully represent:-

That there is a road in the said township which has been a public road but which has been abandoned by the township for many years and no work has been done upon the same for a great many years; that the said road is a road beginning at the Old Oakland School House in said township and extending to Wilson McClure's place in said township, connecting there with the Grampian road. The said road is in bad condition, passes through a swamp and the improvement of it so as to make it reasonably fit for public travel would involve a great deal of expense to the township. It is a road that is difficult to maintain at all times on account of the character of the ground over which it passes. The road is useless and burdensome so far as the township is concerned. It accommodates practically none of the inhabitants of the said township and as to even those that it does accommodate they are all supplied with another road which is being maintained by the township, which replaces the road in question.

Your petitioners respectfully pray for an order to view and vacate said piece of road in order that the township may be relieved of liability for the same.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 21st day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighteen.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Pike

in said County, setting forth that there is a road in the said township which has been a public road but which has been abandoned by the township for many years and no work has been done upon the same for many years, that the said road is a road beginning at the old Oakland School House in the said township and extending to Wilson McClures place in said township, connecting there with the Grampian road.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{create} the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A.G. Kramer, J.S. Michaels, and E.D. Billote,

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ~~road proposed for the said road, and if they~~ ^{road} view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for ~~said~~ ^{road} road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{create} the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the ~~best~~ ^{best} ground ~~and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the said~~ ^{road} necessary for a public ~~or private~~ road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall ~~lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,~~ ^{valleying said} to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of ~~locating a public~~ ^{valleying said} road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them ~~in opening~~ ^{in valleying} the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court or Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

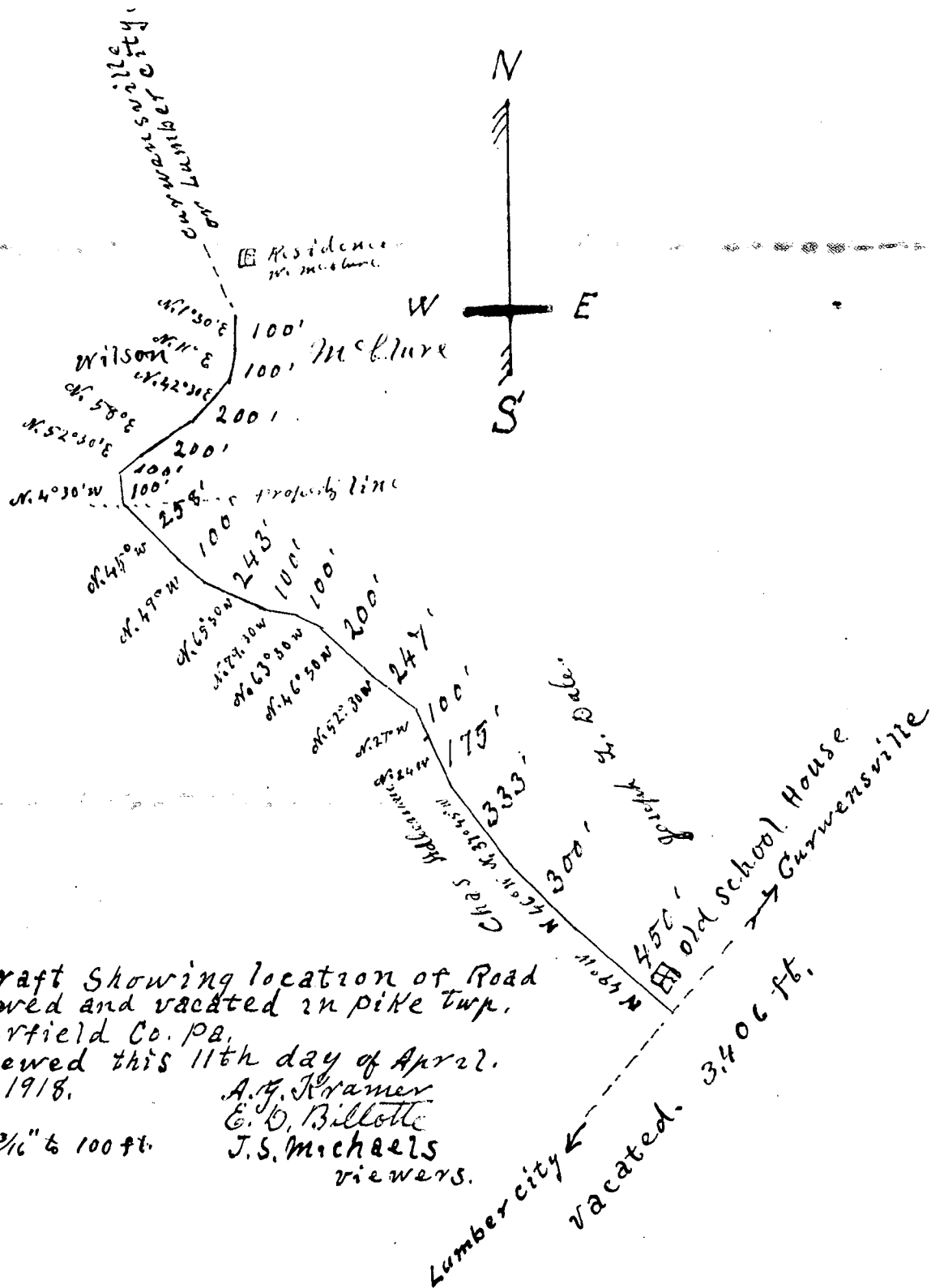
That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Pike and that Three (3) notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 11th day of April

A. D. 1918, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the Friday ~~day~~ 12th day of April, 1918, at 9:30 o'clock A. M. That

~~the~~ viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ~~road~~ road proposed ~~for the above mentioned road~~ to be vacated, and that there were present at the view Charles W Lawhead, Walter Long and A. L. McKee the Supervisors of Pike Township and Charles Addleman Lewis Honban in favor of vacating the road and Wilson McClure opposed to vacating it.

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 12th day of April A. D. 1918, when the following appearances were noted: Charles W Lawhead with A. H. Woodward Attorney for the Township and Wilson McClure who opposed the vacating of said road.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is NO occasion for a ~~said~~ road ~~as desired by the petitioner~~, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the ~~shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do recommend~~ report that said road use the following described road, to wit: Beginning, in the public road leading from Curwensville to Lumber City at a point near what is known as the Old Oakland School House to near the residence of Wilson McClure in Pike Township a distance of 3406 feet which said road passes all the way through woodland along a side hill and is in a very bad condition being a side hill cut and never having been opened over ten feet in width and a good part of the way not over eight feet wide and owing to the grade being steep, part of the way over five degrees it is badly washed out and at the present time not in a fit or safe condition to travel and in view of the fact that there is only one family living along said road who has an outlet by a public road from his residence to the main public road leading from Gramplan to Curwensville without any material increase in the distance and from all appearances that the travel on said road even if kept up would be very limited. The viewers are ~~unanimous~~ of opinion that the township would not be justified in incurring the expense of several hundred dollars which it would require to put said road in a fit condition to travel besides the expense of keeping it up owing to the marshy condition of the ground over which the road passes and owing to the steep grade the wash on the same from heavy rains would make The viewers are therefore of opinion that the said road has become useless, inconvenient and would be burdensome to the taxpayers of the township to keep up and would therefore recommend that the same be vacated.

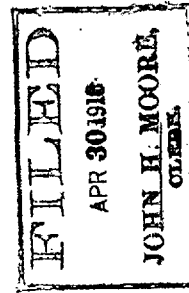

That George Wisor

are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the sum of One Hundred (100.00) Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America to be paid unto the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania its certain attorney, executors, administrators, or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs executors and administrators, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated the 30th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

Whereas a petition has been presented to the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pa to No December Term 1916 to change a portion of a public road leading from Lower Woodland in Bradford Township to Litzs Bridge in Boggs Township from a point in said road at or near the Chestnut Grove School House in Bradfore Township to a point at or near the Bethlehem School House in Boggs Township in said road has on account of the excessive grades and wash outs become inconvenient and burdensome to travel and that the petitioners beleive that said road could be very much improved by a change of the location of that part of said road between said points &c:

And whereas on presentation of the said petition, viewers were appointed by the said Court, and the said action involves the incurring of certain costs incident thereto which shall be first paid out by the county and which in case of failure of said petition may be placed upon upon the petitioners; therefore in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Assembly to secure the county against the payment of said cost when the same is concluded as the Court may direct:

Now therefore the condition of this obligation is such, that if the said petitioners shall pay or cause to be paid all costs which the Court may order and direct the petitioners in said petition to pay and shall indemnify and save harmless the County of Clearfield against any and all costs which may be paid by it as provided by law, and because of the failure of said petitioners to succeed in their application for the change of said road, then this obligation to be void, and of no effect; otherwise to be of full force and virtue.
