At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa; in and for said County, on the 6th day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred Eighteen.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Boggs and Wallacetown Borough.

in said County, setting forth that Public Road leading from a point at or near the intersection of the road known as the Wilson Road with township road running from Bigler to Sanborn in Boggs Township to a point in the street or public road leading from Clearfield to Philipsburg, near Harbison Walker Brick Works in the Borough of Wallacetown.

The part to be supplied is from a point in said road about five hundred eighty-five (585) feet Southwest of the Wallacetown Borough line to a point at the said borough line where the property line between the property's of formerly James K. Turner etc. intersects with ~~the said road~~ and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A.G. Kramer, Esq.

Harry Rocco, and J.S. Michalec,

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for ~~such road~~, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property, and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

The viewers further report, that in the matter of the assessment of damages that the damages assessed in the original road laid out in No 6, May Session 1916 of \$60.00 to James Turner are hereby canceled as James Turner was not then and is not now the owner of the land through which the road was laid out but that the land did then and does now belong to C. I. Wolf and the damages herein assessed are

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.


Viewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Boggs Township and the Borough of Wallacetown, respectfully represents:-

That your Honorable Court will appoint viewers to view, vacate and supply a part of a public road recently laid out and partly opened, leading from a point at or near the intersection of the road known as the Wilson road with township road running from Bigler to Sanborn in Boggs Township to a point in the street or public road leading from Clearfield to Philipsburg, near the Harbison Walker Brick Works in the Borough of Wallacetown.

The part to be supplied is from a point in said road about five hundred eighty-five (585) feet Southwest of the Wallacetown Borough line to a point at the said borough line where the property line between the properties of formerly James K. Turner, now C. I. Wolf and the property of the Harbison Walker Brick Works connects with the said Borough line; thence along the property line of the said C. I. Wolf and the Harbison Walker Brick Works Company in a Northeasterly direction to where the same connects with the recently laid out new road near the said Harbison Walker Brick plant in the Borough of Wallacetown, and vacate that portion of said road recently laid out, to be supplied by the new road to be laid out.
