IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the subscribers hereto, being the Supervisors of Knox Township and residents of the said Township, respectfully represent;

That a part of the Township Road leading from Turkey Hill, at a point near the ~~Joseph Sloan~~ *Christ O'Connor* place to Boardman, in Knox Township, of about three-fourths of a mile in length, has become expensive to maintain, by reason of heavy grade and the repairing of a wooden bridge; and that a part of the road leading from Kelley's mine, to Boardman, of about three-fourths of a mile in length, connecting with the first mentioned road, has also become expensive and burdensome to maintain, by reason of heavy grade and the maintaining of a wooden bridge across Potts Run.

That the grade as well as expense of maintaining said roads can be overcome by the opening of a road to begin at the ~~Joseph Sloan~~ *O'Connor* place to connect with a road from Kelley's mine at Potts Run and the building of one concrete bridge across said run and extending from Potts Run to the Boardman Company barn, a distance of one-fourth mile.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Honorable Court to appoint Viewers to view the said roads and bridges with a view to vacate the two first mentioned roads and two wooden bridges and supply the same by the shorter and more level road and a concrete bridge across Potts Run. And they will ever pray, etc.
