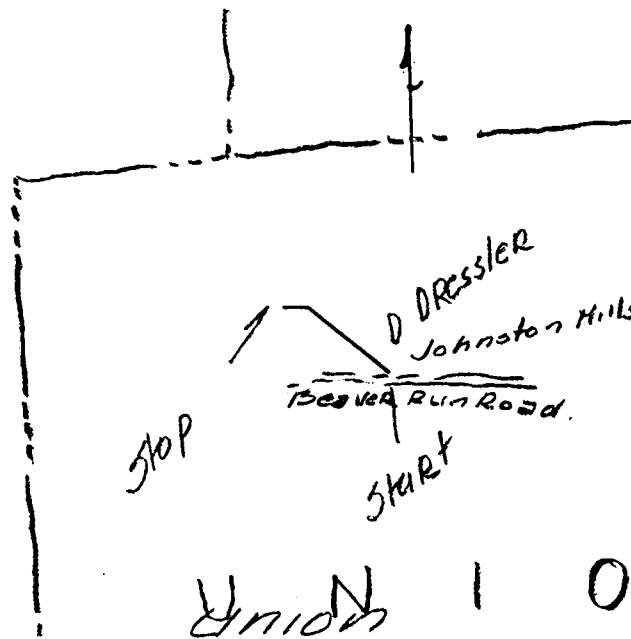

 now composing a Court of General Quarter
 Sessions of the Peace, in and for the said County
 at June Sessions, One thousand eight hundred and
 sixty four. The petition of diverse inhabitants of
 the Township of Union and parts adjacent, in
 the said County respectfully sheweth: That your
 petitioners labour under great inconvenience for want
 of a road, beginning near Blanchards Camp on the
 public road leading from Johnsons Mill to Houston
 Township on the land of Charles Blanchard, thence
 by the nearest and best route untill it intersects
 a public road leading from the Turnpike near
 Rockton Post office to Houston Township, on the
 land of Charles Blanchard, in the said Township.
 Your petitioners therefore respectfully pray your
 Honours to appoint proper persons to view and
 lay out the same according to law. And
 they will pray &c.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 28th day of June A. D. 1864 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from Blanchard

camp on the public road leading from Johnstons Mill to Huston Sp on the Land of Charles Blanchard thence by the nearest and best route to until it intersects a public road leading from the Turnpike near Rockton Post Office to Huston Sp on the Land of Charles Blanchard

Report as to Damages

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Russell Luther, Joseph Lyons and Hains Kirk

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

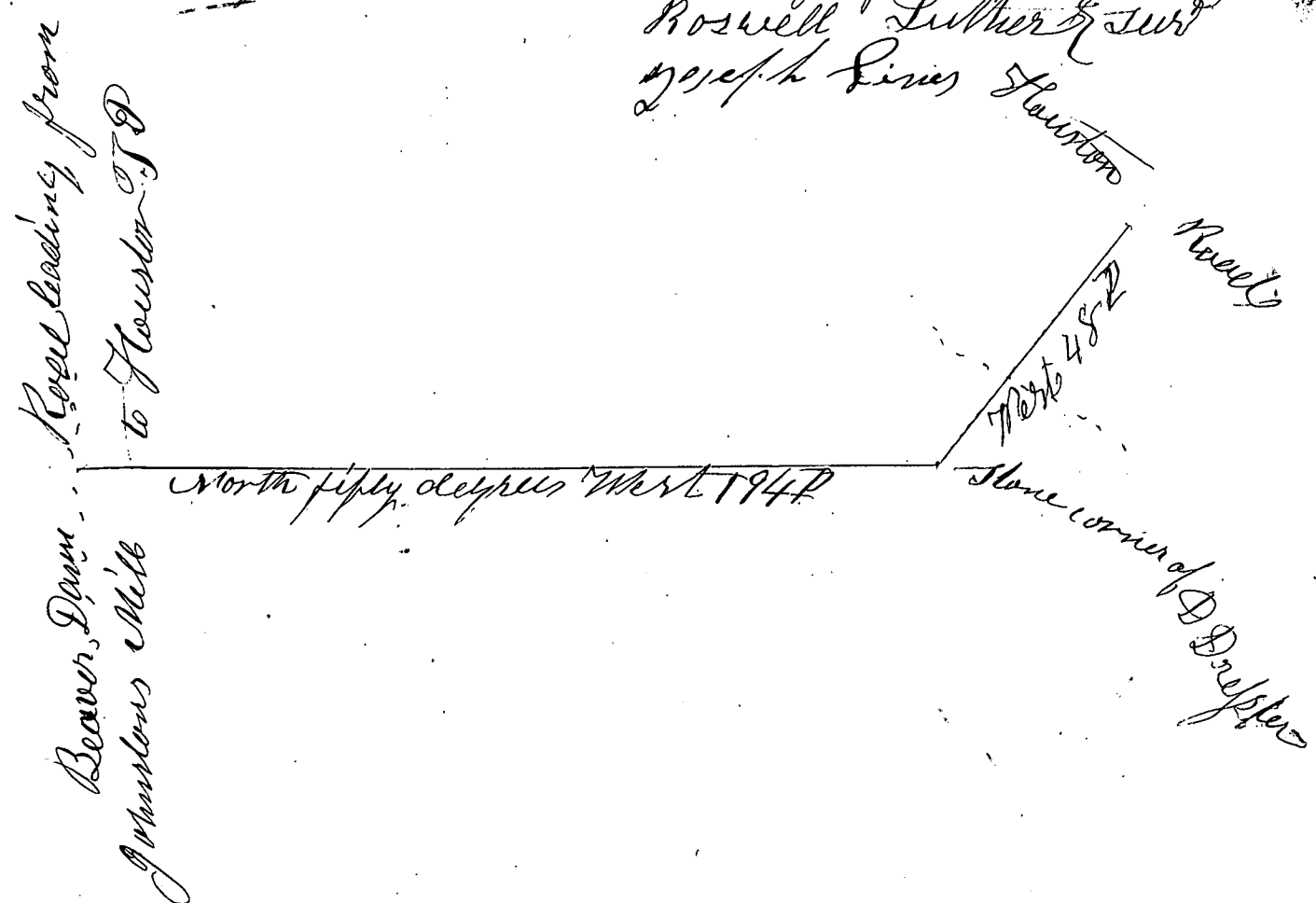

Public Road Beginning at the Townships Road on lands of Philip Blanchard thence North fifty degrees West one hundred and ninety four perches to Stone corner of Daniel Dreyfles East thence West forty eight perches to Public Road leading from the Turnpike near Rockton in Union Township to Huston Township a draft or plat of which is hereunto annexed
