## RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Huston and that four notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the eighth day of April, A. D. 1921, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the twelfth day of April, 1921, at 9 o'clock A M. That all the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view W.H.M.Pea se, H.A.Bonnett and W.J.Lanich, Supervisors of Huston Township and John Salinski and Mike Stanich citizens

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 12th day of April A. D. 1921, when the following appearances were noted: W.H.M.Pea se, H.A.Bonnet Supervisors and Thomas Glass, citizen and School Director.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for use the following described road, to wit: Beginning your viewers were of the unanimous opinion that there is not sufficient occasion for a public road as prayed for and assign as some their reasons therefor the following

First; The evidence of Thomas Glass, member of the School Board of Huston Twp School district testified under oath that the School District of Huston Twp does not own any Public School lot in Bell Hollow, one of the termini of the proposed road as set forth in our order to view.

Second; The sworn testimony of the Supervisors present at the hearing, was that the Township of Huston had no funds with which to open and construct the road

Third; The only feasible route apparent to your viewers for the road would be approximately two and two-fifths miles in length and would if granted and opened afford an outlet for some four families whose primary occupation is the mining of coal, with farming as secondary occupation and the permanence of their residence in that section uncertain.

Fourth; The expense of opening and maintaining the proposed road would be great, greater than the citizens and taxpayers of Huston Township could reasonably be asked to assume for the sparse settlement it would serve.

Fifth; No person or citizen interested for the road appeared at the Public Hearing held by the Viewers.

# Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 7th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-one.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Huston

in said County, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road, to begin at a point in the public road leading from Tyler, Clearfield County, to Weedville, Elk County, Pa., at a point within seventy-five (75) feet of the Pennsylvania Railroad Station in the Village of Tyler in said Township; the one to end at the public School House lot in Bell Hollow in said Township.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers Frank Hutton, Esq., J. E. Fry & George Weber

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.
