Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 16th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-one.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Pike

in said County, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the public road at or near the buildings of Jease Garrison in said township of Pike and extending to a public road at or near the farm buildings of the John I. Bloom estate, now belonging to Blake Bloom, Frank Bloom and Howard Bloom, a distance of approximately three quarters of a mile.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq., E. D. Billotte, Esq., J. S. Michaels.

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road; and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments, which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

REMONSTRANCE

To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of said Court:

The undersigned citizens and inhabitants of the Township of Pike, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represent:

That they are opposed to the grafting of a Public Road leading from the public road at or near the buildings of Jesse Garrison in Pike Township, and extending to a public road at or rear the farm buildings of the John I. Bloom Estate, now belonging to Howard Bloom, Frank Bloom and Blake Bloom, a distance of approximately three-quarters of a mile, for the following reasons:

First: That the present Public Road in said locality is sufficient to supply the wants of the citizens of said Township and parties desiring to travel in said vicinity.

Second: That said road is unnecessary for public convenience and use and instead of being a necessity would be a convenience only to a few, and the costs and expenditures in constructing the road would be an uncalled for burden upon the citizens of the Township.

Third: That there is no increase population along the said proposed public road and there has been an outlet and road sufficient to accomodate all parties in the vicinity of said road.

Your petitioners pray that the petition for said road as prayed for in the above proceedings to No. 1 September Sessions, 1921, be refused for the reasons above set forth, and they will ever pray.
