

Now March 1921 served this notice on H. M. Hughes, George Test and Jacob Baughman the supervisors of Decatur Township personally by handing each of them a true and correct copy of the same.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 8th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-one,

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Decatur

in said County, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a public road at or near William Kephart in said township to another public road at or near the residence of George Demchak.

They respectfully pray that a view may be granted upon the said road and that the same may be laid out and constructed as a public road in Decatur Township.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A.G. Kramer, Esq.,

J.W. Spangle, and Harry Reese,

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned ~~viewers~~ ^{undersigned} ~~do~~ ^{do} agree that there is an occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the name is ----- necessary for a Public ----- road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of the Township road and Hale Street; leading to the Borough of Osceola near the residence of William Kephart in Decatur Township.

Thence running south fifty six (56) degrees, forty five (45) minutes; west five hundred and forty nine (549) feet between the following properties, to wit; William Kephart, George Demchak, on the one side, and Joseph Cahoot, Andrew Cahoot and Jos Hobba, to the public road, leading from Osceola to Scotch Hollow in Decatur Township over a street or lane dedicated to the use of the aforesaid property owners along said lane or street forms public outlet. -----

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees,

No damages assessed as the road is laid out over land dedicated for a street or lane for an outlet for the benefit of the aforesaid adjoining property owners. Therefore none of the adjoining property owners is damaged by the opening of said road.

Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for paid road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

and to other stages of the life cycle of the parasite from larva to adult. The life cycle of the parasite is shown in Figure 1. The adult worm is a small, yellowish, worm-like creature, about 10 mm. long, which attaches itself to the mucous membrane of the rectum. The female worm is larger than the male and has a prominent vulva. The eggs are laid in the rectum and are passed out with the faeces. The eggs hatch in the soil and the larvae penetrate the skin of the host. The larvae then migrate through the body to the rectum where they develop into adult worms.
