In re petition to vacate and supply a road in Lawrence Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.) No. 4 September Sessions 1921

Now December 1, 1921, the Whitmer-Steel Company, by its attorneys, Miller & Hartwick, files the following exceptions against the confirmation absolute of the report of the viewers made in the above entitled case.

FIRST: The termini of the road proposed to be vacated, as well as of the proposed road to supply the part vacated, are not set forth in the petition with sufficient certainty and definiteness.

SECOND: The termini of the road vacated by the viewers, as well as the termini of the road laid out by the viewers to replace the road vacated, are not set out in the report of the viewers with sufficient certainty and definiteness.

THIRD: The proceedings show on their face that the road laid out to supply the road vacated passes over and through land owned by the Whitmer-Steel Company; and the proceedings on their face fail to show any notice to the Whitmer Steel Company of the time and place of view or of hearing; and that no such notice is attached to the papers in said proceeding.

FOURTH: That in fact the Whitmer-Steel Company had no actual notice of the proposed view and location of said road over and through their land prior to the time of the actual view and of the hearing at the court house by said viewers, and had no opportunity of presenting to said viewers such objections as they might have to the location of said road over and across their lands in a proper and sufficient way.

FIFTH: That Elmer Zimmerman the person named in the report of the viewers, as the agent of the Whitmer-Steel Company, was not in fact the general agent of said company; that no notice was even given to him of said view or hearing until the morning upon which the view was held and he had no time to communicate with said company, and did not so communicate with said company until after both the view and the hearing were over, and said company then had no opportunity of appearing before said viewers either at the view or at the hearing.

SIXTH: That the new road laid out for the purpose of supplying the road vacated crosses the siding track or tracks of the Whitmer-Steel Company at grade in two different places; that no permission for the crossing at grade for said siding or siding tracks has been obtained from the Public Service Commission of the State of Pennsylvania; that the construction and building of said road at grade across the siding track or tracks of said company, it is believed would greatly interfere with the business of said company and create a condition that might be very dangerous in the use and operation of said tracks by said company ..





RETURN OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lawrence and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 16th day of June 1921, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 17th day of June 1921, at 9 o'clock A. M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the day of A. D. 191, when the following appearances were noted:

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, ~~the undersigned~~ viewers, do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the Mount Joy road at the new bridge across Moose Creek in Lawrence Township, thence on the Mount Joy road north; thirt (30) degrees, thirty (30) minutes; West three hundred and thirty three (333) feet over the Mount Joy road to the Railroad Crossing of the B. R. & P. Railroad over the said Mount Joy road: Thence still over the said Mount Joy north ~~thirty~~ (30) minutes; twenty eight (28) degrees; west, one hundred and fifteen (115) feet: Thence north twelve (12) degrees, west one hundred and eighty six (186) feet; Thence over cleared land of the Witmer Steel Company north fifty six (56) degrees; East five hundred and eighteen (518) feet across the double side tract of the Witmer Steel Company (practically abandoned) and over side tract of the Patterson Brick plant to line of land of the Joseph Shaw Estate: Thence over improved farm land of the Joseph Shaw estate; North, eighty nine (89) degrees, fifteen (15) minutes, East one thousand seven hundred (1700) feet to corner of woodland of the said Joseph Shaw Estate: thence over woodland of the said Joseph Shaw Estate south seventy three (73) degrees, thirty (30) minutes, East three hundred and thirty five (335) feet to line of land of Baney: Thence over uninproved land of the said Baney South seventy three (73) degrees, thirty (30) minutes, East, three hundred and thirty (330) feet to the intersection of the Township road leading from Clearfield to Wolf Run. who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location; and make report of such assessments, which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.


Viewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
