And that the said viewers all having been present at the view and after having made said view do agree that there is necessity for said bridge.

They further agree and are of the opinion, that the expense of building a permanent bridge will be greater than the said Township of Huston is financially able to bear; they are advised that the estimated cost of construction of a bridge according to the plans and specifications as prepared and approved by the State Highway Department of Penna, will be approximately three thousand (\$3000.00) dollars and that the State will bear one third of the cost of construction. A Blue Print of the Plans and Specifications made and approved by the State Highway Department of Pennsylvania are filed herewith and made part of this report.

On the basis of the estimate of cost of construction furnished your viewers, we recommend that the County of Clearfield assume the payment of one fourth part of said estimated cost of construction, or seven hundred and fifty (\$750.00) dollars.

EXCEPTIONS TO REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge:-

Respectfully come Penfield Coal & Coke Company by
L. W. Smith, General Manager, and John Horning, resident in
Huston Township, and except to the proceedings in the above
matter for the following reasons:

(i). That the proposed bridge over Laurel Run is not in the public interest, but is a private matter intended only for the benefit of two families resident about a mile distant therefrom.

(2). That the public highway on which the present bridge crosses Laurel Run terminates about a mile and a half therefrom in the woods or wilderness, is not a through highway or thoroughfare, and the construction of the proposed bridge will involve a waste and extravagance of the public funds.

(3). That the tax payers in Huston Township in whose interest and behalf the exceptants are in part acting have not had sufficient opportunity to present their views and objections to the viewers appointed in the case.

(4). That the proceedings in this case exceptants are advised, are invalid for the following reasons:

(a) That there was no corporate action by the County

Commissioners of Clearfield County, whereby advertising and public hearing of the proposed view and subsequent proceedings thereon could be waived.

(b) That there was no meeting of the supervisors of Huston Township by virtue of which a hearing and advertising could be waived.

(c) That the attempted waiver of advertising and hearing is contrary to public policy and void.

(d) That no sufficient nor proper opportunity has been offered exceptants and those they represent to appear before the viewers and make known the desires of the taxables.

(5). That by reason of the informality of the proceedings the exceptants are advised, and therefore, aver, that the findings of the viewers are void.

(6). That the present structure is adequate for the needs of the public traveling over the highway leading from Penfield road to Elk County, on which the proposed bridge is to be constructed, and a comparatively small outlay will put it into condition to serve the traveling public who use it for many years to come.

WHEREFORE, the exceptants pray that the report of the viewers be set aside.


