IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PA.
Petition to vacate road in Penn Township leading from the Green-
wood Township line to its intersection with a public road leading
from James McEwens to the Irish settlement School House, the
point of intersection being at or near James McEwens.

TO THE HONORABLE THE PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE SAID COURT.

The undersigned citizens and residents of the said town-
ship in said County respectfully represents:-

That there was originally located a road in Penn and
Greenwood Townships leading from the public road which runs from
James McEwens to the Irish settlement school house and joining
said road at or near James McEwens; thence by way of Popular Run
through Penn Township and into Greenwood Township and inter-
secting the Bell Run road in Greenwood Township at or near
Johnsons Factory; that said road has been vacated so far as the
same is in Greenwood Township and the part of the road that is in
Penn Township is useless and burdensome to the township and does
not accommodate the public travel. It has not been kept up
as a public road for some years.

Your petitioners respectfully pray that the said road from
the Greenwood Township line to its terminus at or near James
McEwens may be vacated.



Viewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 13th day of October in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one

By the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the said Court: - Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Penn, in the County aforesaid setting forth that there was originally located a road in Penn & Greenwood townships leading from the public road which runs from James McEwens to the Irish settlement school house and joining said road at or near James McEwens; thence by way of Popular Run through Penn Twp. and into Greenwood Twp. and intersecting the Bell Run road in Greenwood Twp. at or near Johnsons Factory; that said road has been vacated so far as the same is in Greenwood Twp. and the part of the road that is in Penn Twp. is useless and burdensome to the Twp and does not accommodate the public travel.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq. E. D. Billotte, and J. S. Michaels who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the plot, or draft, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Penn -----, and that three (3), ----- notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

15th day of December ----, A. D. 1922, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 16th --- day of December ---- A. D., 1922, at nine o'clock A.M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view William Helper and Charles Wall two of the Supervisors of Penn Township: -----
