CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 22nd day of March A. D. 1864 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from a Road from

James Woodsides place now George Meares to the Erie Turnpike

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~view and lay out~~ the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *Russell Luther, Seaver Gilgal & John Reed*

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

by the said Court to view vacuate & supply a
road leading from the James Woodsides place now George
Weavers to the Erie Turnpike in Brady Township

Do report that having, first giving public notice of the
time and place according to law and after having all
been sworn and affirmed in the manner & form
prescribed by the said order that all of us Roswell
Luther Liver Allegat & John Reed having viewed
the ground and parts adjacent for said road
etc layout and now return the same for public
use.

Beginning at the line of the Woodsides and Hause
place thence East Sixty eight perches, thence ^{along and parallel} North Sixty Six
degrees East twenty seven perches still along said road
thence South Seven degrees East ^{twelve} 20 perches still along the
same road thence North eighty one degrees East forty
two perches thence North fifty eight degrees East sixteen
perches thence North twenty four degrees East twenty
three perches thence East ten perches thence North Sixty
degrees East twenty perches thence North eighty one ^{plus} degrees
East fourteen perches thence North eighty five
degrees thirty perches still along the old road thence South
