At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 29 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-one,

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Pike

in said County, setting forth that your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Pike, to begin at a point on the line between the lands of Clarence Witherow and Bert Owens in a public road leading from Bloomington Cemetery to said point of division, and extending thence to a point near Olanta in another public road leading from Olanta to Bloomington

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq.,

E. D. Billotte, Esq., and J. S. Michaels

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit;) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Pike _____ and that Three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 13th day of October _____, A. D 1921, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 14th day of October, 191_____, at (9) o'clock A. M. That the _____ viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view A. L. McKee and George Anderson two of the Supervisors of Pike Township, also John Bowman, Samuel Bowman, Clarence Witherow and Nathan Johnson. _____

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 14th day of October 1921, when the following appearances were noted: and witnesses called and examined to wit: A, M, Liverlight Esq; Hon A. O. Smith, and A. H. Woodward Esq; Also S, W, Witherow, Samuel Bowman, Harry Cathcart, George Anderson, C W Lawhead and A. L. McKee the Supervisors of Pike Township all in favor of the road, and also A B Ownes Samuel Wise, Arnold Bloom, Vern Bell, Stanley Douglas Lynn Dotts, Howard Bloom and Blake Bloom opposed to the road.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the Petitioners and the Opposers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the public road on the dividing property line between A B Owners and Clarence Witherow; in Pike Township; thence over land of the said Witherow the following courses and distances; to wit: South six (6) degrees, thirty (30) minutes; East one hundred (100), feet; thence South eighteen (18), degrees ten (10), minutes, East three hundred and seventy four (374), feet, Thence south twenty five (25), degrees, thirty (30), minutes, East two hundred (200), feet: Thence south, thirty seven (37), degrees, fifteen (15), minutes, East seven hundred (700), feet: Thence south thirty four (34), degrees thirty (30), minutes; East two hundred and eighty four (284), feet to the property line of Samuel Bowman. ORDER

To view a road for public use in the township of Pike Clearfield County

Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


