To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge:-

The petition of Dorothy Eisenhauer and Laura Kobbman respectfully represents :-

(1). That they are the owners of property in the village of Morrisdale, Morris Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, described as follows:

Beginning at a post in the center of the Morrisdale Pike road; thence along line of Wm. Bend South 87-3/4 degrees East 30 rods to a post; thence along line of James Donaldson's land North 88 degrees West 30 rods to a post in the center of Morrisdale Pike road; thence along line and center of Morrisdale Pike road North 9 degrees East 8 rods and 9/100 links, back to place of beginning, containing 1½ acres, more or less.

having thereon erected a two story frame hotel building known as the "Export House", barn and other outbuildings.

(2). That the State Highway Commissioner of the State of Pennsylvania has undertaken the construction of an improved state highway known as Route No. 313, through said premises, a change of width and of existing lines and location being occasioned thereby.

(3). That your petitioners have sustained damage by reason of said road construction, and they have been unable to agree with the County Commissioners of Clearfield County as to the damage sustained by them.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray the Court to appoint Viewers to ascertain and assess their damages, as provided by the Act of April 6, 1921, Amending Section 16 of the Act of May 31, 1911, P. L. 468; said amendatory act being No. 62 of the Statutes of 1921, and as provided by other pertinent acts of Assembly.



doth well and truly certify that the premises in the County of Clearfield, setting forth that they are the owners of property in the Village of Morrisdale, Beginning at a post in the center of the Morrisdale Pike Road; thence along line of Wm. Bend South 87-3/4 degrees East 30 rods to a post; thence along line of James Donaldson's land North 88° West 30 rods to a post in the center of Morrisdale Pike Road; thence along line and center of Morrisdale Pike road North 9° East 8 rods & 9/100 links; and back to place of beginning; containing 1/2 acres, more or less, having theron erected a two story frame hotel building known as the "Export House" barn and other outbuildings.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers Harry Reese, A. L. Edwards, Esq., and Jas. W. Spangle

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments, which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


