To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of said Court:

Petition of the undersigned respectfully represents:

That your petitioners are residents of the Township of Woodward, County of Clearfield, State of Pennsylvania, and that the present Township road, passing near the village of Morann in said Township from railroad crossing at #5 to another crossing known as Mountz' Crossing, is of great inconvenience and little value to the residents of the village of Morann and the immediate vicinity, and

That there is a shorter and more convenient route now used by said citizens going on the north side of the railroad and parallel to the same from #5 crossing to Mountz' Crossing.

That it is the belief of the undersigned petitioners that it would be of great benefit if said road would be made a Township road, and that at the present time said road is kept and maintained by the residents of the village of Morann, but is used by the majority of the people traveling through said vicinity, and that if said road were made a Township road it would not require the taking of any property.

That said proposed Township road should begin at a point on the Township road on the north side of the Moshannon Branch of the Tyrone and Clearfield Railroad at the crossing of said railroad known as Mountz' Crossing and proceed in an easterly direction parallel to said railroad to a point on the Township road opposite a crossing known as #5 Crossing.

A rough sketch of said neighborhood showing the Township road and the road referred to in the petition as the proposed new road is attached and made a part of this petition.

WHEREFORE your petitioners pray the Court to appoint qualified persons to view the premises and inquire into the expediency of making said road a public road and otherwise proceed as directed by Acts of Assembly in such cases made and provided.



**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the undersigned  
**Viewers, appointed by the Court of Quarter Sessions of**  
**Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, to view and supply a Public**  
**Road leading from** a point on the Township road on the North side of

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 5th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-two

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward

~~in said County, setting forth that the present Twp. road passing near the village of Morann in said Twp., from RR crossing at #5 to another crossing known as Mountz' Crossing, is of great inconvenience and little value to the residents of the village of Morann and the immediate vicinity and that there is a shorter and more convenient route now used by said citizens going on the north side of the railroad and parallel to the same from #5 crossing to Mountz' Crossing. That said proposed Twp. road should begin at a point on the Twp. road on the north side of the Moshannon Branch of the Tyrone and Clearfield Railroad at the crossing of said railroad known as Mountz' Crossing and proceed in an easterly direction parallel to said railroad to a point on the Twp. road opposite a crossing known as #5 Crossing.)~~

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. L. Edwards, Esq Harry Reese and J. W. Spangle

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

# RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 31st day of August A. D. 1923, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the first day of September, 1923, at 11 o'clock A. M. That three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view A. L. Edwards, Harry Reese + James Spangle, viewers. parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 1st day of September A. D. 1923, when the following appearances were noted: Cortley Bell Esq. representing petitioners, A. L. Edwards, Harry Reese and James Spangle viewers and Rev. Horst,

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a Public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for Public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at a point on the Township Road on the north side of the Moshannon Branch of the Tyrone + Clearfield Railroad at the crossing of said railroad known as Mountz's Crossing, thence N. 52° W. 108 feet, thence N. 36° 30' E. 894 feet, thence N. 48° E. 2047 to the place of ending, on the Township Road leading from Hubbard to Hoxtondale (see map herewith)

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting (none)

when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from all residents along proposed road (see signatures on back of this report)

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows: none

## ORDER

To view and supply a

**NOTE.**—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as he location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


