To the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield, County, Pennsylvania,


The petition of the undersigned, Supervisors of Cooper Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, represents:

That in said Township is a certain public road known as the Winburne-Munson public road, which extends from a point at or near the Howe Hotel in Winburne to a point at the Station of the New York Central Railroad Company in the village of Munson.

SECOND: That a portion of said road is very hilly and expensive to the Township to maintain, and difficult for travel. That a more advantageous and better piece of road can be obtained by extending said road around the base of the hill from a point at or near the residence of Ervin Laddie.... to a point at or near the trolley track, close to the Fardee Block of houses.

THIRD: That in the opinion of your petitioners it would be more advisable and advantageous to the Township that said road should be changed and the new location adopted.

Your petitioners therefore pray that viewers may be appointed to vacate that portion of the said road between the points as herein given and to supply the same with a new road as hereinbefore suggested, and they will ever pray, etc.

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of

COOPER and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 29th day of March 1923, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 30th day of March 1923, at 9.30 o'clock A.M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Lewis Linberg, Harry H Berg and Lawrence F Flood the Supervisors of Cooper Township and Julius Schachtschneider;

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 30th day of March A.D. 1923, when the following appearances were noted: Lewis Linberg one of the Supervisors with H B Hartswick Esq of the firm of Miller and Hartswick Attorney's for the Supervisors of Cooper Township;

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned ~~viewers~~ the change of the said route viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at a point in the public road leading from Munson to Winburn near the residence of Irvin Ladue one hundred and thirty (130) feet east of the public road leading from Munson to Kylertown near the residence of August Cittrick: Thence over improved land of the said August Cittrick, south eighty seven (87) degrees thirty (30) minutes, west one hundred and thirty (130) feet to public road, leading from Munson to Winburn. Thence across the public road thirty three (33) feet to line of land of Julius Schachtschneider. Thence over improved land of said Julius Schachtschneider south sixty seven (67) degrees, west two hundred (200) feet to line of land of August Cittrick. Thence over improved land of the said August Cittrick, south fifty six (56) degrees thirty (30) minutes, west one hundred (100) feet. Thence south, forty five (45) degrees, west one hundred (100) feet. Thence over uninproved land of the said August Cittrick the following courses and distances to wit: south fourteen (14) degrees, west one hundred (100) feet. Thence, south two (2) degrees, west eight hundred (800) feet to a point in the public road leading from Munson to Winburn, as shown on the draft attached as part of the report of the viewers. The part of the said road marked on the draft by dots has not been changed supplied or vacated.

But the part of the said road near the block of houses of the Pardee mines as shown on the draft has been vacated and supplied as follows. The part of road as shown on the draft to wit Beginning at a point as shown on draft, thence running south fifty five (55) degrees, thirty (30) minutes, west fifty (50) feet: Thence south nineteen (19) degrees west three hundred (300) feet. thence south twelve (12) degrees, east fifty fifty (50) feet; Thence south thirty three (33) degrees forty five

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 19th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-two.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of ~~subscribers~~^{Supervisors} inhabitants of the Township of Cooper

in said County, setting forth that a certain public road known as the Winburne-Munson public road, which extends from a point at or near the Howe Hotel in Winburne to a point at the Station of the New York Central Railroad Company in the village of Munson.

That a portion of said road is very hilly and expensive to the Township to maintain, and difficult for travel. That a more advantageous and better piece of road can be obtained by extending said road around the base of the hill from a point at or near the residence of Irvin Ladue to a point at or near the trolley track, close to the Pardee Block of houses.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq. E. D. Billotte, Esq. and J. W. Spangle

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may, be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road; and the time and place of hearing.

ORDER

To tax Vacate and supply a road for public use in the township of Cooper Clearfield County

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Viewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


