At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 12 day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty-three

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Lawrence

in said County, setting forth that your petitioners residing in the Pleasant Dale section of Lawrence Twp. suffer great inconvenience on account of the excessive and unusual grade on the Public Road leading from Clearfield to Pleasant Dale School House at the intersection of the Wesley Ogden land and to end at the forked roads near Richard Rishel's Residence, being about one-fourth mile, and they will ever pray

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq. E. D. Billotte, Esq. and J. S. Michaels

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may, be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

## RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lawrence and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 26th day of January A. D. 1923, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 27th day of January, 1923, at (9) o'clock A. M. That Two of the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Sylvester Green, W. S. Pifer and Wesley Ogden;

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 27th day of January A. D. 1923, when the following appearances were noted: appeared and were heard; Sylvester Green, W. S, Pifer and Wesley Ogden besides John H Thompson and J R Fullerton two of the Supervisors of the Township of Lawrence;

And After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is an occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is public necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at a point in the public road, leading from Clearfield Pa to Wesh Ogden near the residence of I Wesley Ogden; on the dividing property line between I Wesley Ogden and Richard S Rishell in Lawrence Township Clearfield County Pennsylvania. Thence running North five (5) degrees, twenty seven (27) minutes; East, nine hundred and seventy five (975) feet on the dividing property line between the said I Wesley Ogden and Richard S Rishel as above stated; so as to make the dividing property line between the said I Wesley Ogden and Richard S Rishel the center of the new road laid out; To the centre of the public road leading from the Mount Joy Church and School House to Wesh Ogden near the residence of Rishard S Rishel in Lawrence Township in the County and State aforesaid.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT We, S. S. Green,  
Jeff Butler and Joseph Shaffer, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the sum of Fifty Dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made, we do bind ourselves, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally by these presents.

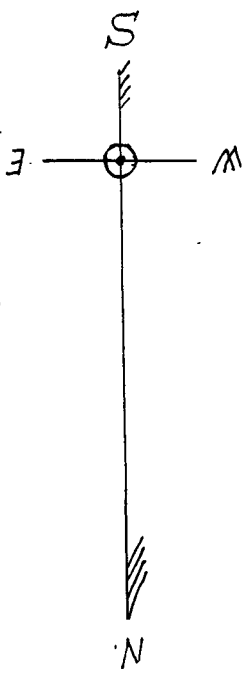

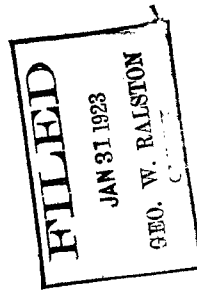
NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
