Petition for Public Road in Sandy Twp

Versus

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 21st day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred twenty three

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Sandy

in said County, setting forth that viewers be appointed to lay out a public road Beginning at the public road known as Main Street Extension at line of land of James Jefferys near the Spear Mill Site in said township near the residence of William Shaffer, and ending at the State Road Route No 60, 676 feet East of Jefferson County line in said Township

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers J. E. Fry, Frank Hutton, Esq., and George Weber

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Sandy and that three or more notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the first day of August A. D. 1923, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the sixth day of August, 1923, at 9 o'clock A. M. That all the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view ~~W.C. Pentz, Atty for Sandy Twp. Dist. L.E. Boyer, Atty for the petitioner, M.J. McCraight and Wm. Shaffer for the petition, W.S. Hand Supervisor, J.P. Logan, George Bearfield, Mary Calvert, Wm. Anderson, Wm. Dixon, P.S. Heberling, Samuel Postlethwaite~~, parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the sixth day of August A. D. 1923, when the following appearances were noted: ~~W.C. Pentz, Esq Atty for Sandy Twp road Dist. L.E. Boyer Esq., Atty for petitioner, M.J. McCraight and Wm. Shaffer for the petition and W.S. After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a Public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for use the following described road, to wit Beginning The draft hereto attached follows what is locally known as the "Kiwanis Trail" which is a road privately layed out and constructed for over two miles running mostly through unimproved lands and at the time of the view was in very fair condition. It extends mostly through wood land and is a most delightful driveway for any purpose, but especially for a pleasure drive, it is so located that good drainage can be had. The evidence offered estimated the costs of draining widening and straighning the road at from \$6000.00 to \$7000.00, your viewers are inclined to view this estimate as high but recognize that it would cost a considerable sum to properly construct.

The Viewers felt that their chief question to determine was its necessity as a public road. The preponderance of the evidence offered was decidedly to the effect that it was not necessary for a public road, that it was about one mile from where the Kiwanis trail intersects the Spear's Mill road, near the residence of Wm. Shaffer by the Spear's Mill road to where it intersects with the concrete road known as State Highway Route No. 60, while from the same point the Kiwanis trail is 10656.1 feet to Route No. 60.

So far as your Viewers have been advised there are only three families residing along the proposed road and it appears they have had a road over private lands for many years, that the oldest settler along the proposed road kept it up himself and during a portion of this time at least, was exonerated from his road tax, for so doing. If the road these citizens have been using is closed to them, the law provides a






