At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the **2nd** day of **October** in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and **twenty four**

By the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of **Bell**, in the County aforesaid setting forth that a certain piece of road situate in Bell Twp and about three-fourths of a mile in length, being that portion of public road beginning at a point on the concrete road known as "Route #62" near where the Newtonburg road intersects with the same and extending Southwest over the Pennsylvania Railroad tracks and also by a subway under said tracks and along the old school site across four railroad tracks of said Pennsylvania Railroad Company to a point on said concrete road known as "Route #62" near the house of W. W. McGee, has become useless and burdensome to said township and ought to be vacated.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers A. G. Kramer, Esq. Geo. K. Weber and J. S. Michaels who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day, was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of BELL; _____, and that THREE (3) _____ notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

23d, -- day of October, _____, A. D. 1924 and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield.

Pa., on the 24th day of October, ----- A. D., 1924, at nine o'clock A.M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view besides the viewers H. D. Kuntz, and S. W. Lee two of the Supervisors of Bell Township; _____

And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 24th -- day of October, A. D. 1924, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: H. D. Kuntz, S. W. Lee, two of the Supervisors of Bell Township and William B Stephenson of Bell Township _____

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has _____, become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to wit; Beginning at a point at the intersection of the new concrete State road leading from Mahaffey to McGee's on Route No. 62 six hundred and fifty (650) feet west of the intersection of the public road known as the Newtonburg or Clover Run road with the said concrete State road in Bell Township.

Thence running South West one hundred and thirteen (113) feet to the Pail Road tract of the _____, Pennsylvania Railroad. Thence across said Railroad tract twenty three (23) feet. Thence in a South Westerly direction; Four Hundred and forty eight (448) feet to a bridge across what is known as Whiskey Run. thence over said bridge across said run; forty (40) feet in length; Thence South West, two hundred and seventy eight (278) feet to a subway where said road passes through under said railroad Twenty feet. (20) Thence in a South Westerly direction eleven hundred (1100) feet to the crossing of the four tracts of the Pennsylvania Railroad a distance of eighty three (83) feet across said Railroad tracts

Thence in a North Westerly direction, Six Hundred and Ninety Five (695) feet to where the said road intersects with the said Concrete State Road Route Number sixty two (62) leading from Mahaffey to McGees near the residence of W. W. McGee in Bell Township Clearfield County Pennsylvania. They therefore recommend that said portion of said road as described be vacated, having by reason of the construction of the said State ^{road} become useless and burdensome upon the taxpayers of the Township. to keep up.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacation of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from:

The viewers after a careful inspection of the premises are fully convinced that none of the property owners along said road vacated are in any way damaged they therefore assess no damages.

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows:

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

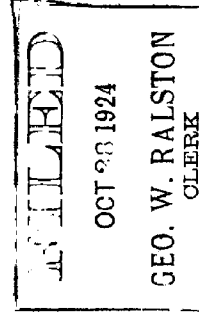

To the Honorable A. R. Chase President Judge of said Court:-

The petition of the undersigned, constituting the board of Supervisors of the Township of Bell, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and a number of other citizens of said township respectfully represents:-

That a certain piece of road situate in Bell Township afore-said and about three-fourths (3/4) of a mile in length, being that portion of public road beginning at a point on the concrete road known as "Route #62" near where the Hextonburg road intersects with the same and extending Southwest over the Pennsylvania Railroad tracks and also by a subway under said tracks and along the old school site across four railroad tracts of said Pennsylvania Railroad Company to a point on said concrete road known as "Route #62" near the house of W. W. McGee, has become useless and burdensome to said township and ought to be vacated.

That said portion of road was formerly a part of Route #62 but when the State Highway was constructed the route thereof was changed to the present route #62, thus eliminating the various railroad crossings referred to; that the school house along said road has also been moved and that there are now no houses or places of business whatsoever located along said portion of road desired to be vacated.

Wherefore, your petitioners respectfully pray that an order may be granted by the Court for the viewing and vacation of said portion of public road.
