And the condition of this obligation is such that if the Judge of the said Court shall by any decree or order direct that we shall pay the costs or any part thereof, of the expenses of the said proceeding, then and in such case we do bind ourselves jointly and severally to pay in the Office of the Clerk of said Court any such costs or part thereof as may be assessed to us, within ten days from the date of the making of such order or decree, and in such case this obligation is to be null and void; otherwise to be and remain in full force and effect.

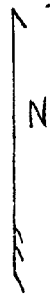

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lawrence and that Four notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 23d day of April A.D. 1924, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 24th day of April, 1924, at 9 o'clock A.M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view E. W. Brown Esq the Attorney for the petitioners, V. Rowles one of the Supervisors of Lawrence Township and the following citizens residents in the community and in to wit W L Holden, Wm Wilson Hugh McKenrick S G Hills D S Evans & others parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 24th day of April A. D. 1924, when the following appearances were noted: E. W. Brown Esq, Attorney for the petitioners and the following witnesses to wit who were called and sworn: H. C. McKenrick, S, G, Hill, J, L, Hubizicki, D. S. Evans, Howard Showaker, Mrs Leonard H Phillips, Mrs E C Reed, and William L, Holden, all in favor of the road:

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is an occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is ----- necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at the corner or intersection in the plot laid out in town lots by the heirs of the late Richard shaw Sr deceased on the streets dedicated as streets to the public at the time said plot was laid out in town lots at the corner of what is known as first Street and Wallace Street; thence running North eighty six degrees west four hundred and fifty (450) feet on Wallace street to corner of second Street. along the properties shown: Thence running south four (4) degrees; West Eight hundred and forty feet on what is known as west second Street along the properties shown on the draft to the corner of what is known as Patterson Street; thence south Eighty six (86) degrees, East Four hundred and eighty (480) feet on what is known as Patterson Street along the properties shown on the draft to the corner of front Street: Thence running North, four (4), degrees, East Eight hundred and forty (840) feet along Front Street along the properties shown on the draft to Wallace Street: Thence South Eighty Six (86) degrees; East Three Hundred and eighty two (382) feet on what is known as Wallace Street to a point on the bank of the Susquehanna River near the residence of H. who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly quali-
fied to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of
their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view
the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road
they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may,
be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner
as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly
whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or
draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which
the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at
an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when
by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that
limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they
shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any
damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land
refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into
view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of
such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter
Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they
have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the
time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time
and place of hearing

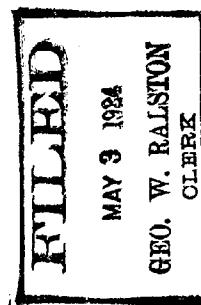
NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
