IN RE: PETITION TO VACATE

PUBLIC ROAD IN UNION TOWNSHIP:

To the Honorable A. R. Chase, President and Sole Judge of
said Court:-

The petition of the undersigned, residents of
the Township of Union in said County, respectfully represents:-

That a road has been long since layed out in said
Township, beginning at a point in the Public Road leading from
Home Camp to Rockton, said point being near the Northeastern
corner of what is known as the Eri Fletcher Farm; thence in a
Northeasterly direction crossing the reservoir of the water
system of the City of DuBois and traversing lands known as
Alfred Bailey, Joseph E. Hummel, Elizabeth La Borde and J. A.
Parrish, and apparently terminating at a point in lands of said
J. A. Parrish, said road being approximately four thousand
(4,000) feet in length;

Your petitioners believe that said road has now
become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to maintain;

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court that the
said road may be vacated agreeably to the Act of the General
Assembly in such case made and provided;



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty five

By the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Union, in the County aforesaid setting forth that a road has been long since layed out in said Twp. beginning at a point in the public road leading from Home Camp to Rockton, said point being near the Northeastern corner of what is known as the Eri Fletcher Farm; thence in a Northeasterly direction crossing the reservoir of the water system of the City of Du Bois and traversing lands known as Alfred Bailey, Joseph E. Hummel, Elizabeth La Borde and J. A. Parrish, and apparently terminating at a point in lands of said J. A. Parrish, said road being approximately four thousand (4,000) feet in length; Your petitioners believe that said road has now become, useless, inconvenient and burdensome to maintain.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers Frank Hutton, Esq., J. E. Fry and
GEO. K. Weber who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of UNION, and that Three notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

seventh day of April, A. D. 1925, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome and recommend that the same be vacated as partitioned for to wit:- from a point in the Public Road leading from Home Camp to Rockton, near the North Eastern corner of what is known as the "Eri Fletcher Farm" thence extending across the Reservoir of the City of DuBois to a point near where the barn of J.A. Parrish, formerly stood, a distance of some 36 1/3 feet and as shown by the draft or survey, hereto attached and made part of this return.

ORDER TO VACATE

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the root of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages

of the road, they will report to time circuits.
