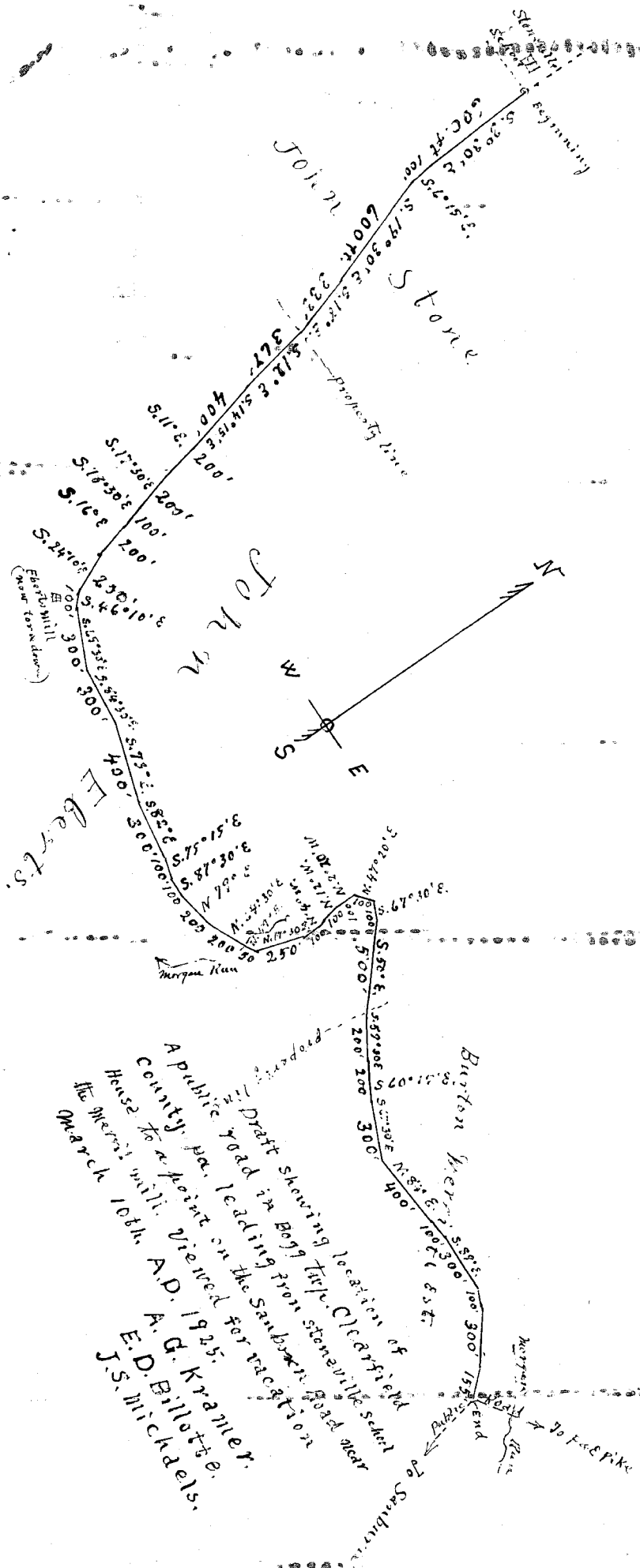

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 14 day of January in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty five

By the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry Supervisors inhabitants of the Township of Boggs, in the County aforesaid setting forth that ..Part... part of a road leading from Stoneville to the Sandburn road at or near Merritts Mills, to-wit, the portion thereof commencing at the Stoneville School House and leading to junction with Sandburn road at or near Merritts Mills has become useless for public travel and burdensome for said township and is no longer required as a public road.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers Aaron Kramer, Esq. Ed Billotte and

Jack Michaels who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Boggs -----, and that Three; ----- notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

tenth day of March -----, A. D. 1925, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the eleventh day of March ----- A. D., 1925; at nine o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view Cyrus Robison and Charles Bush, two of the Supervisors of Boggs Township; -----

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the Eleventh day of March -----,

A. D. 1925, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: to wit; Cyrus Robison and Charles Bush two of the Supervisors of Boggs Township with their Attorney A. H. Woodward Esq; -----

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has -----, become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the taxpayers of the Township ----- ip to keep up which runs all the way through unimproved woods land as follows: beginning at the lot of the Stoneville School House now abandoned thence running south thirty (30) degrees, thirty (30) minutes East six hundred (600) feet. Thence South six (6) degrees, fifteen minutes East One hundred (100) feet; Thence South nineteen (19) degrees, Thirty (30) minutes, East six hundred (600) feet; Thence East, five (5) degrees, eighteen (18) minutes, East three hundred and thirty three (333) feet to property line; Thence south twelve (12) degrees, Three (3) minutes East, Three Hundred and sixty seven (367) feet; Thence South fourteen (14) degrees fifteen (15) minutes; East four hundred (400) feet Thence south Eleven (11) degrees, East two hundred (200) feet Thence south seventeen (17) degrees, thirty (30) minutes; East two hundred (200) feet; Thence south eighteen (18) degrees, thirty (30) minutes East one hundred (100) feet: Thence south sixteen (16) feet East two hundred (200) feet; Thence south twenty four (24) degrees, ten (10) minutes East two hundred (200) feet: Thence south forty six (46) degrees, ten (10) minutes; East, one (100) feet Thence south sixty five (65) degrees, thirty (30) minutes East three hundred (300) feet. Thence south eighty four (84) degrees, thirty (30)

minutes East three hundred (300) feet. Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
