CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 28th day of June A. D. 1865 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from the Township Road near Patchinville to the Road at Thomas Shonipers -

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Jacob Boice, Samuel Brickley and Jonas Snyder who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

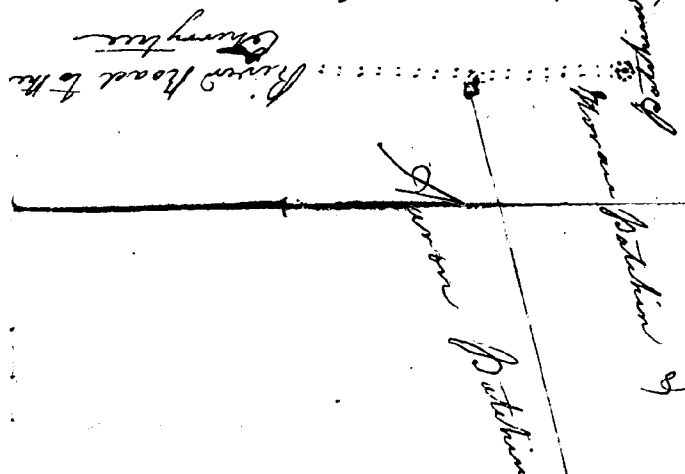

Report, To the Honorable the Judges
 within named; We the persons Appointed
 by the within Order of Court to view and
 Lay out the Road therein mentioned after
 having duly sworn according to Law do
 Report. That in pursuance of the said Order
 we have viewed laid out and return for
 public use, the following Road viz. Beginning
 At the Township Road near Patchinville at
 a post about forty perches South of Horis Patchins
 Thence South South Eighty one and a half Degrees East
 One hundred perches to a hemlock, thence South Eighty
 three and a half Degrees East fifty four perches to a hemlock, thence
 South Eighty nine Degrees East twenty perches to a hemlock, thence
 South Seventy two Degrees East forty five perches to a Beech, thence
 South fifty seven Degrees East thirty two perches to a post in the old
 Road, thence South Seventy two and a half Degrees East fifty four
 perches to a hemlock, thence South Sixty seven Degrees East thirty
 six perches to a Maple, thence South forty three Degrees East
 thirty eight perches to a post, thence South sixteen Degrees
 East thirty one perches to a post, thence South Seventy two
 and a half Degrees East fifty four perches to the public
 Road leading from Youngs Meeting house to the Cherry tree
 on land of Thomas Thompson a Draught Whereof is
 herunto annexed as witness our hands and seals
 This 19th Day of August A.D. 1865, The Day of the View
 was made known by handbills put up lawfully, & no damage found for
 said Road)
